In-house testing

Virginia Tech's COVID-19 Lab has a capacity of 1,000 tests per day.

All on-campus residents are to be tested during the move-in period from Aug. 14 to Aug. 23.

Testing is not required for students living off campus, but off-campus students who are at-risk – those who believe or know they have been exposed to the virus, traveled to Blacksburg from a hot spot, or have symptoms or other

indications of exposure – should contact Schiffert Health Center to determine whether they should be tested.

Testing will be done with an approach that collects a sample from the middle of the nose, avoiding the need to have a swab pushed into the far reaches of the sinuses.

The lab at the Fralin Biomedical Research Institute in Roanoke generally delivers results within 24 hours.
