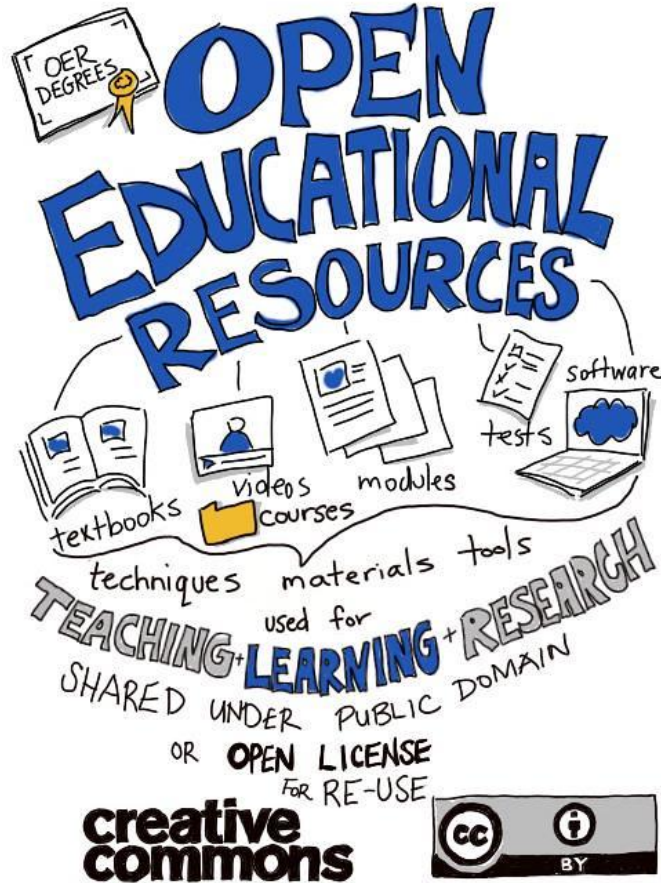

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OVAC Guiding Principles (2017)

- **Long-term sustainability**, which will help institutions and students to control costs in the long run, as opposed to short-term affordability gains.
- **Shared interest and investment in processes and infrastructure** to enhance teaching and learning.
- **About teaching**: Sharing faculty development opportunities and resources in an effort to foster development and recognition of teacher excellence, innovation, scholarship and diversity. Include contributions of resources that are openly available. Fostering faculty excellence, scholarship, and diversity. Elevation of teaching & learning via professional development opportunities
- **About scholarship**: publishing in open access journals and other formats;
- **Evidence-based, collaborative, and informed approaches** to innovation and decision-making
