"*Research on Emerging Technologies for Teaching and Learning*" (RETTL) is a cross-directorate program, managed by NSF's Education and Human Resources (EHR) and Computer and Information Science and Engineering (CISE) Directorates, **with participation from** the Engineering (ENG) and **Social, Behavioral and Economic Sciences (SBE) Directorates**. Considered an incubator program that provides an opportunity for interdisciplinary teams to try out new ideas that involve an element of risk, it is the new iteration of the former NSF "Cyberlearning" program. New RFA Addresses Cancer Risk in Rural Populations

NIH has announced a new request for applications, *Social and Behavioral Intervention Research to Address Modifiable Risk Factors for Cancer in Rural Populations* (R01 Clinical Trial Required). Selected projects will develop, adapt, and test interventions to address risk factors for cancer in rural populations.

Proposals should focus on primary prevention and assess and address one or more of the social and behavioral risk factors that contribute to cancer disparities in rural populations: tobacco use; diet, physical activity and weight; alcohol use; UV exposure; and HPV vaccination. Black, Latinx, Native American Households hit hard by COVID-19

A report from NPR, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health find **African Americans, Latinx and Native Americans are disproportionately more likely to be experiencing financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic**. The report, [The Impact of Coronavirus on Households, by Race/Ethnicity](#), is the second in a series based on a survey of nearly 3,500 adults conducted this summer.
