The Consortium of Social Science Associations (COSSA) has released its **2020 College and University Rankings for Federal Social and Behavioral Science R&D, which highlight the top university recipients of research dollars in the social and behavioral sciences.** This data comes from the National Center for Science and Education Statistics' Higher Education Research and Development (HERD) Survey for fiscal year 2018. Virginia Tech currently ranks #75 with \$7,468,000 in research dollars.
