
Robert Morrill was elected to the College of Arts and Sciences Personnel Committee for a two-year term beginning 1991-92.

Charles Good presented "AIDS in Africa: Research and Social Realities" to the Worldwatch Seminars on January 17.




"Environmental Education in Virginia" was the topic of Dr. Richard Bambach's presentation to the Lecture Series on April 10.


