NIH Updates from the Office of Sponsored Programs

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) is now using new forms for proposal submissions as of today, January 25, 2022. **This version of the forms includes significant changes to the Biosketch and Other Support documents which will be required moving forward.** For additional information about new NIH requirements, visit the Office of Sponsored Programs website.

In addition, soon the federal government will stop using the DUNS number to uniquely identify entities. Entities doing business with the federal government will instead use a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) created in System for Award Management (SAM.gov). Virginia Tech has already obtained its new UEI which will be used for all federal grant submissions. It is QDE5UHE5XD16 and should be used in proposal documents when requested.
