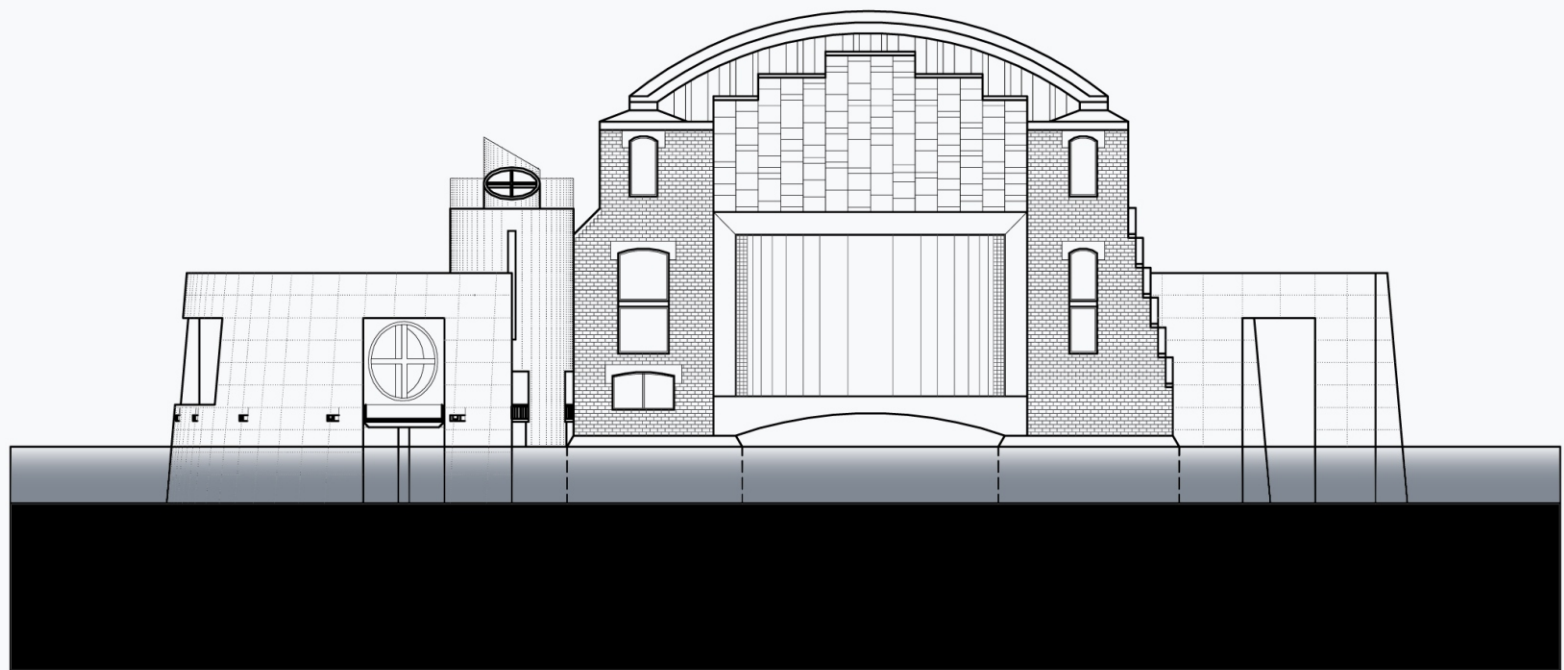
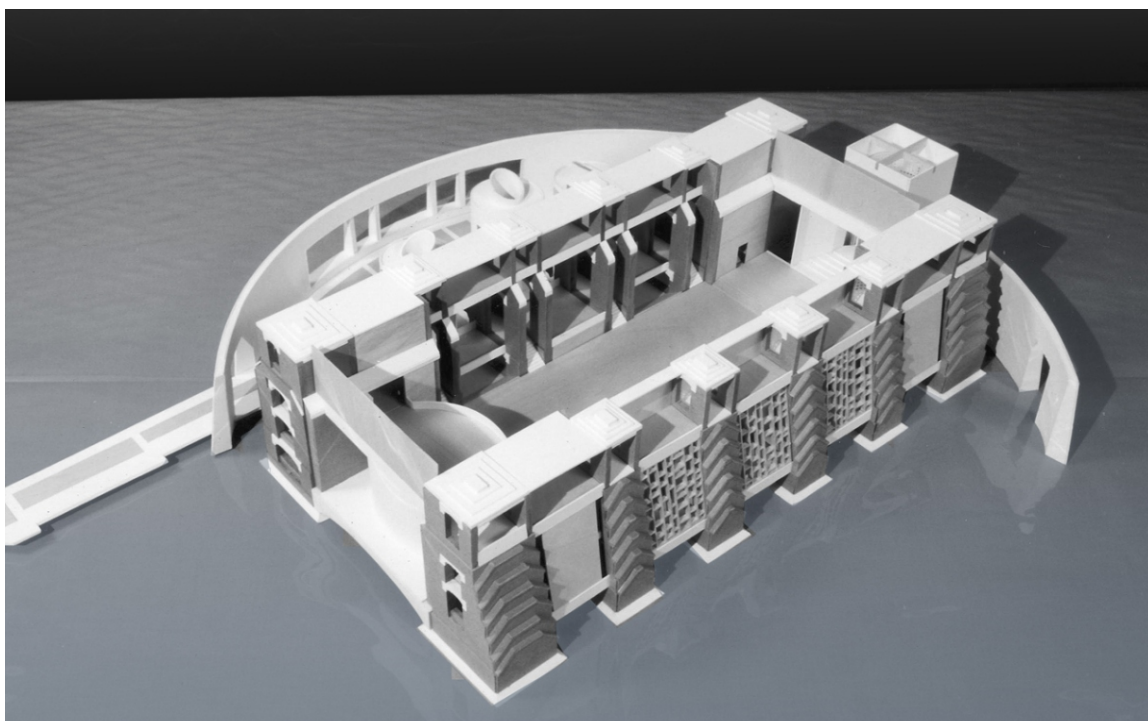


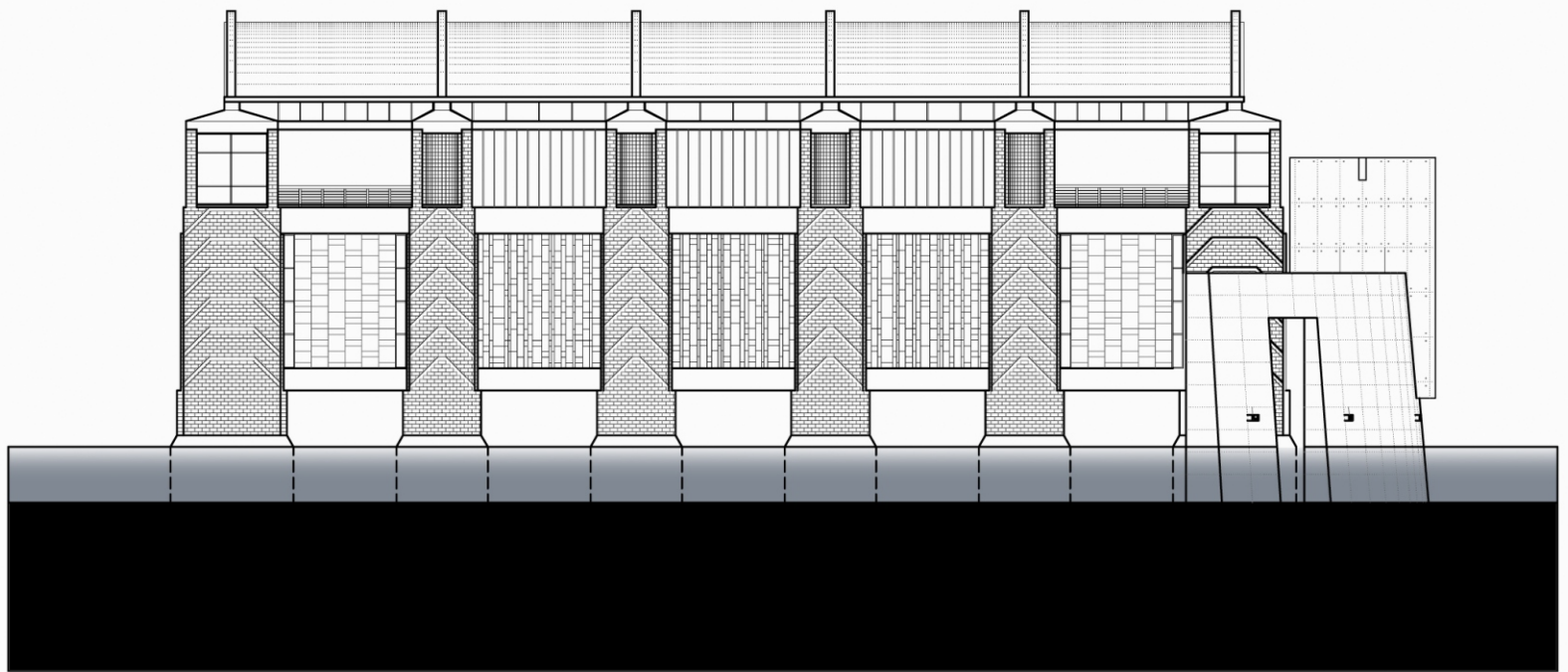


West Elevation

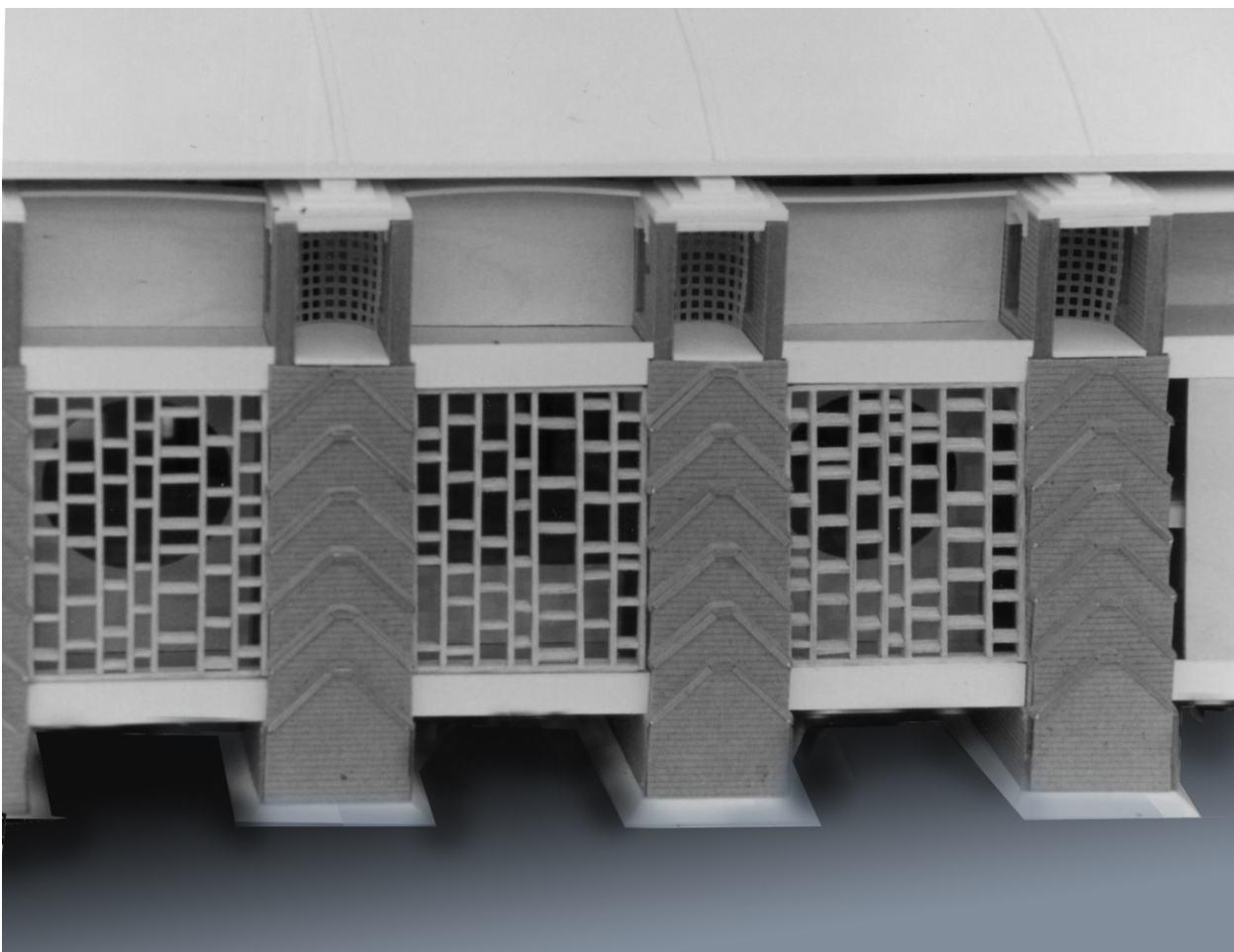
Facing east one finds the altar placed on a large elevated floor. Behind it is the baptistery, a glass block cylinder set within a concrete box which has symbolic cross cut out of the east face. Early morning light illuminates the cross through the glass block. During the day the baptistery is brightly illuminated from above and the cross becomes a shadow. The baptistery is the only part of the structure precious enough to penetrate the encompassing wall.

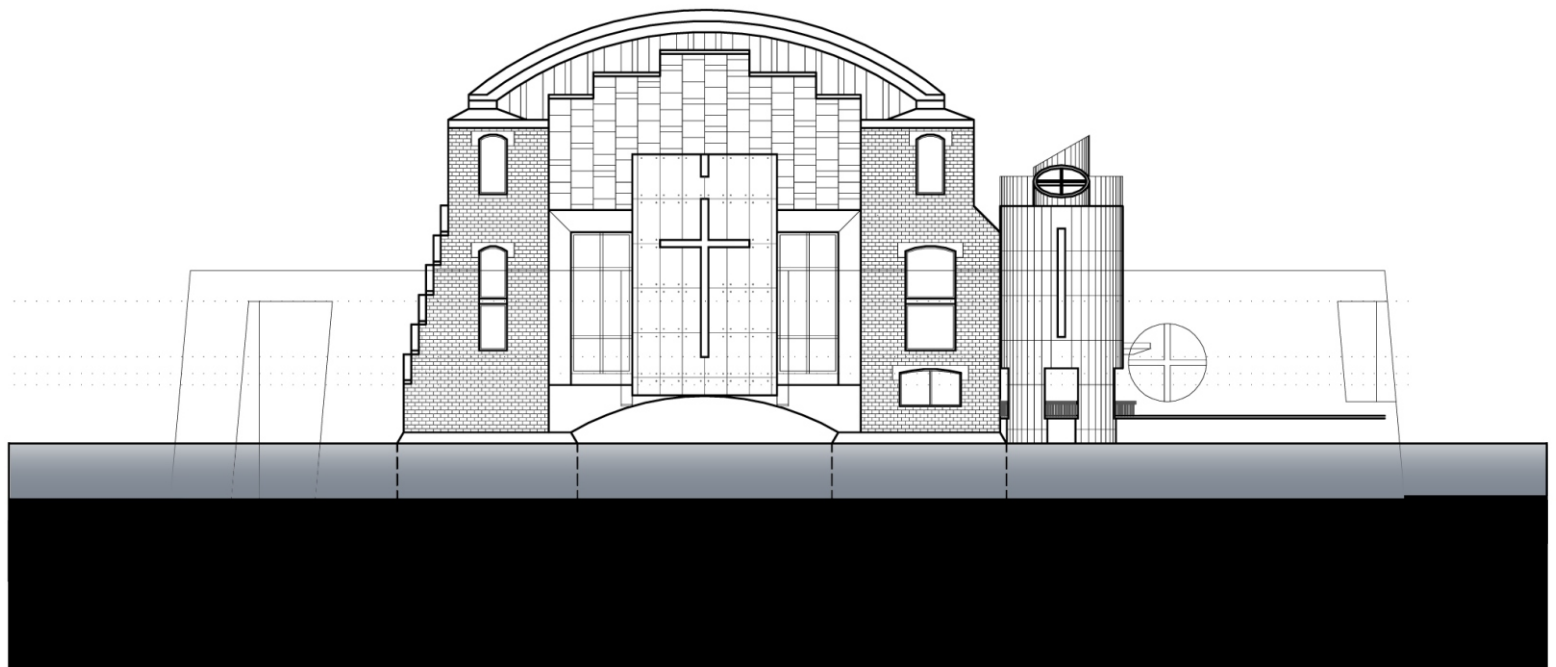
At the west end of the building is a series of ramps for handicap access and a choir loft. The roof and ceiling are a simple vaulted structure kept smooth and free from articulation. It is lifted up above its supports by clerestory windows.



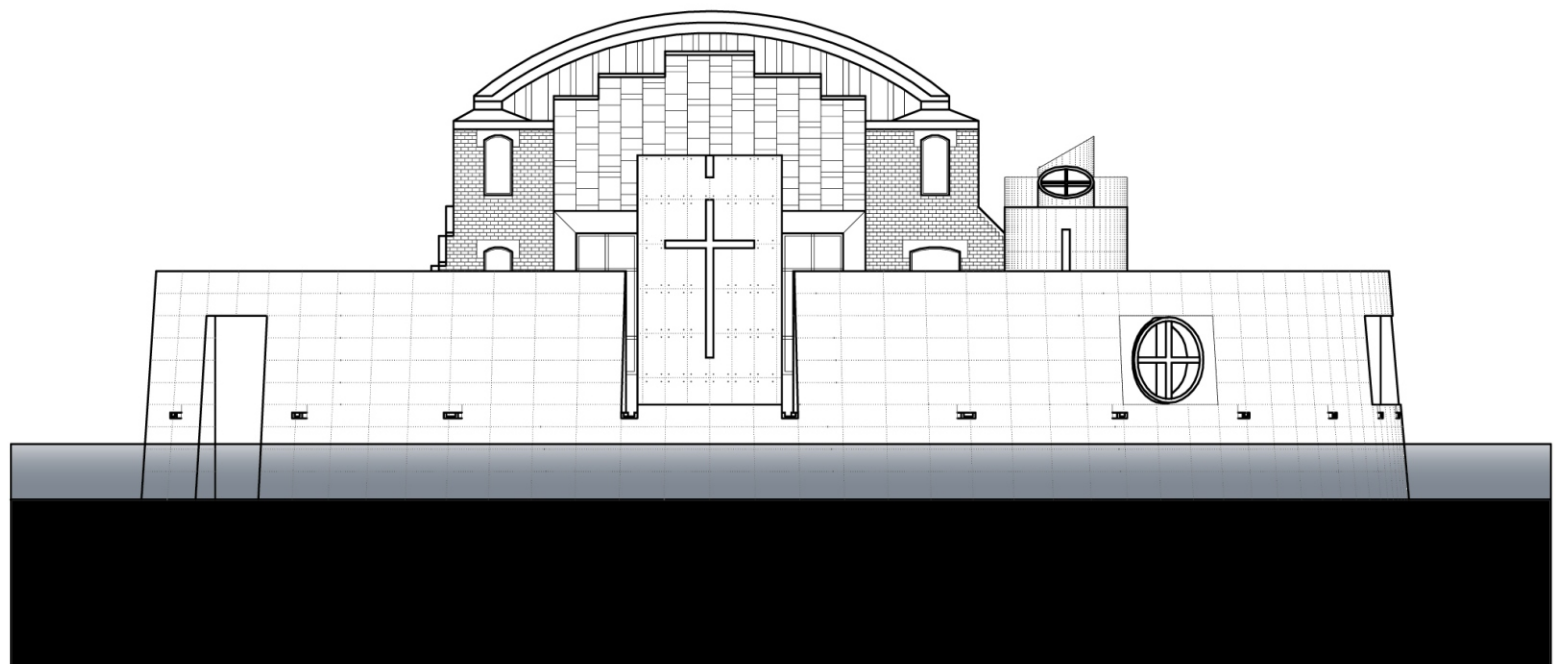


South Elevation

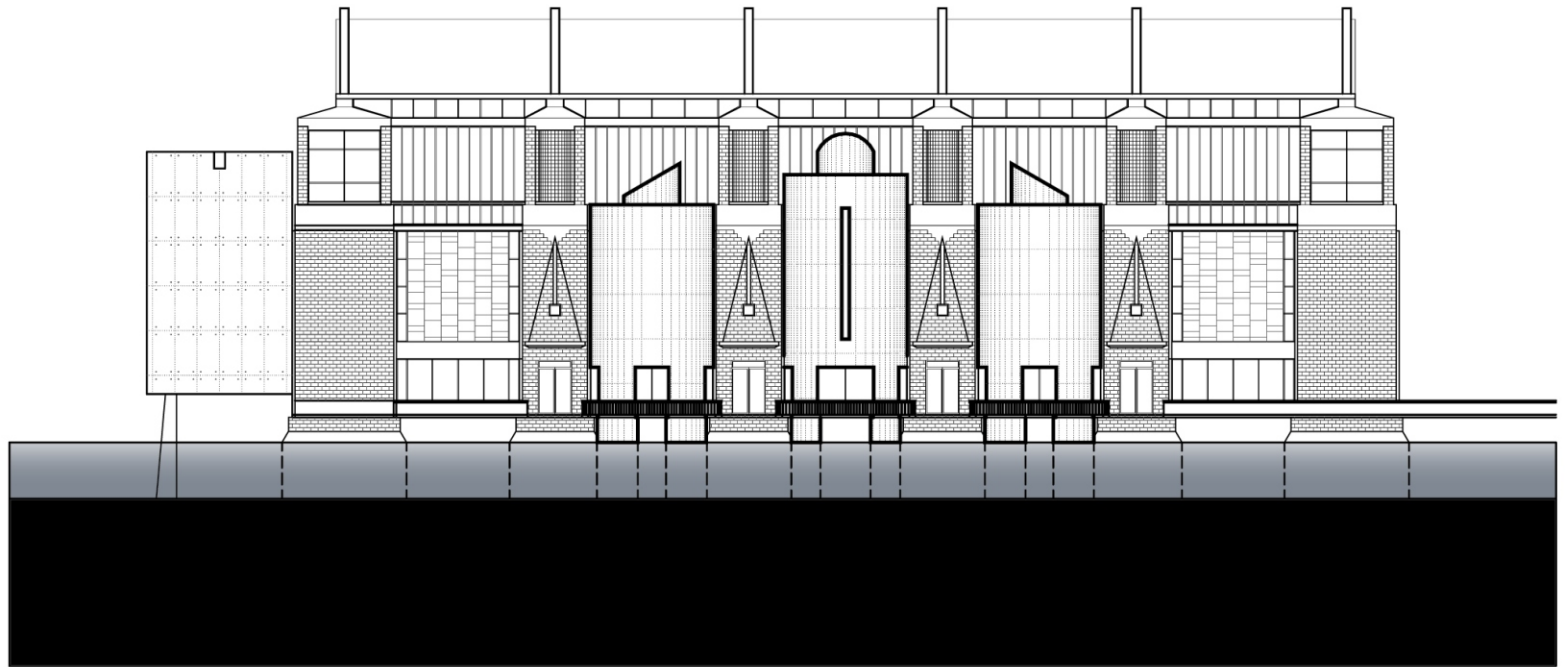




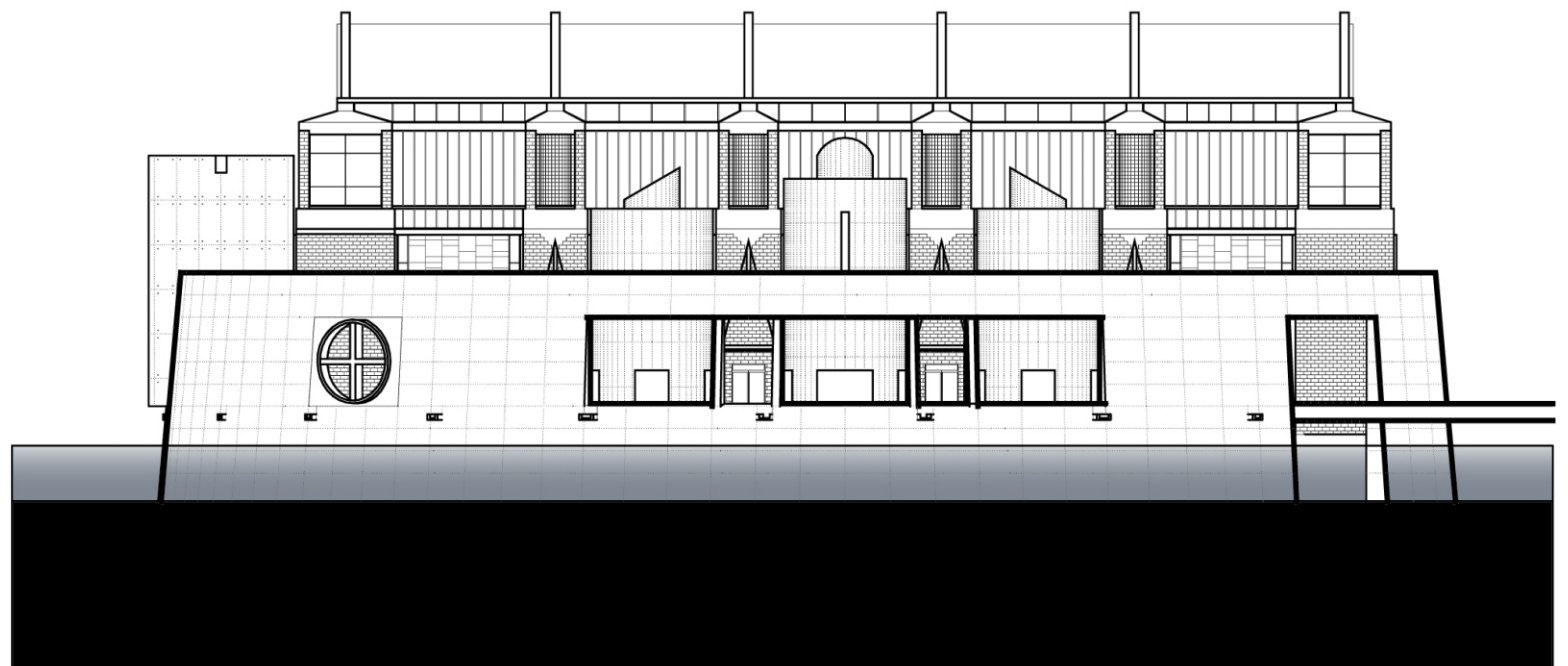
East Elevation-Inside Outer Walls



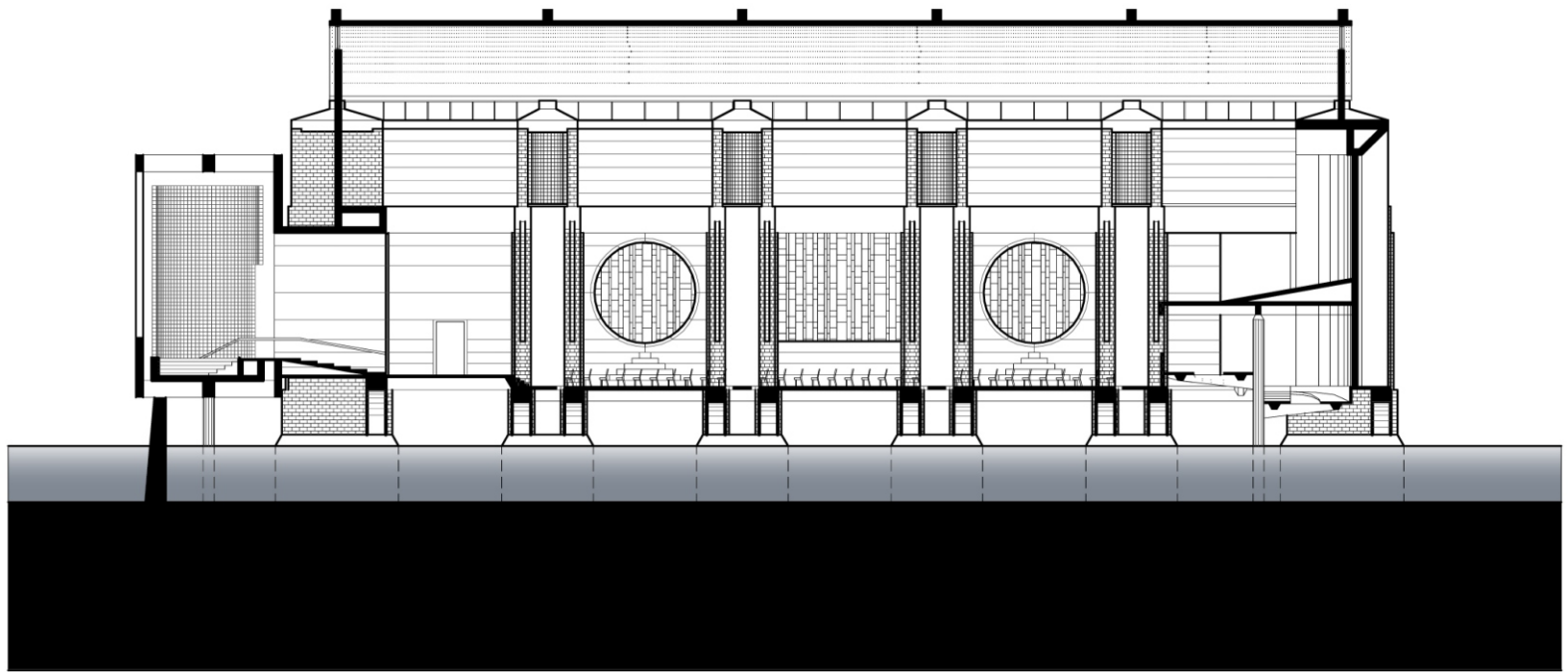
East Elevation



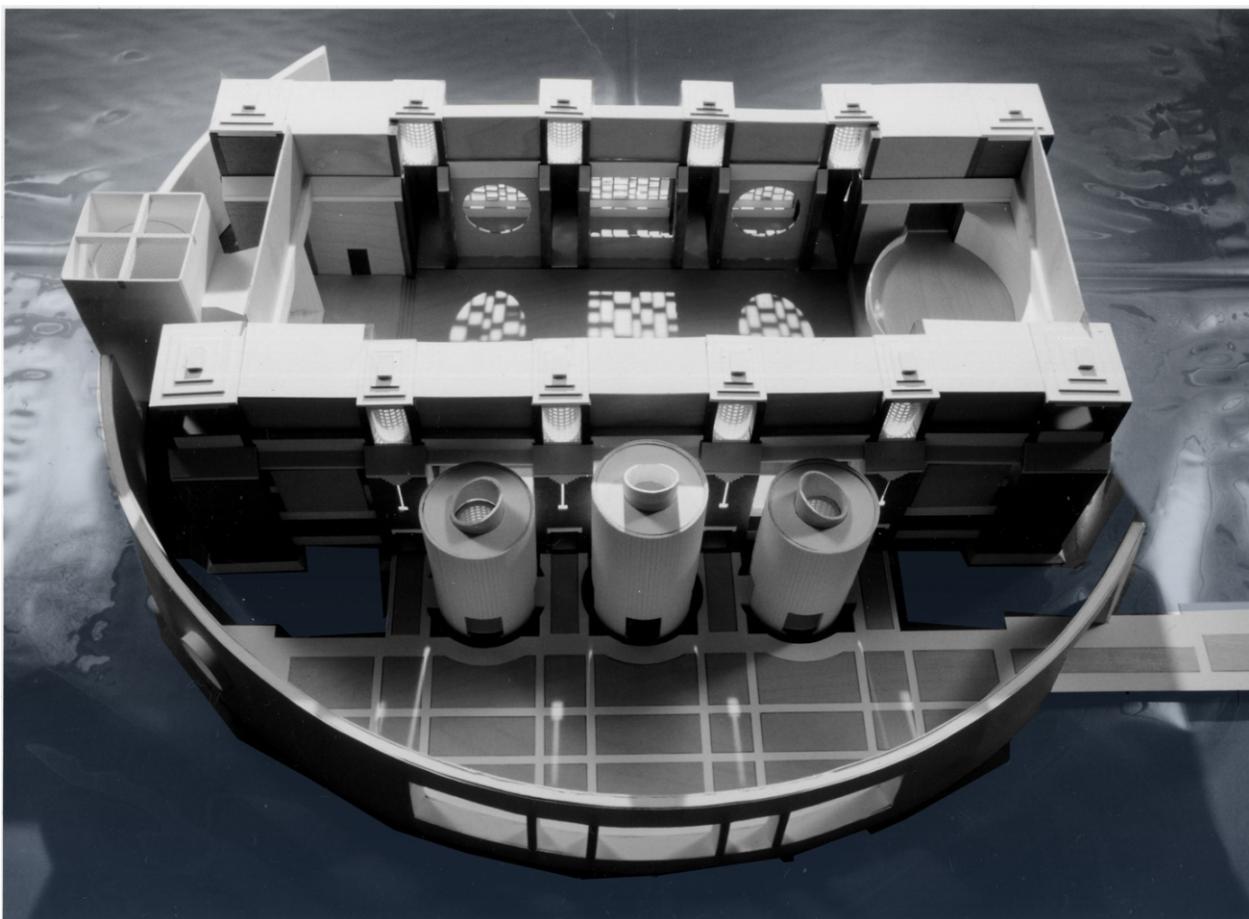
North Elevation- Inside Outer Walls

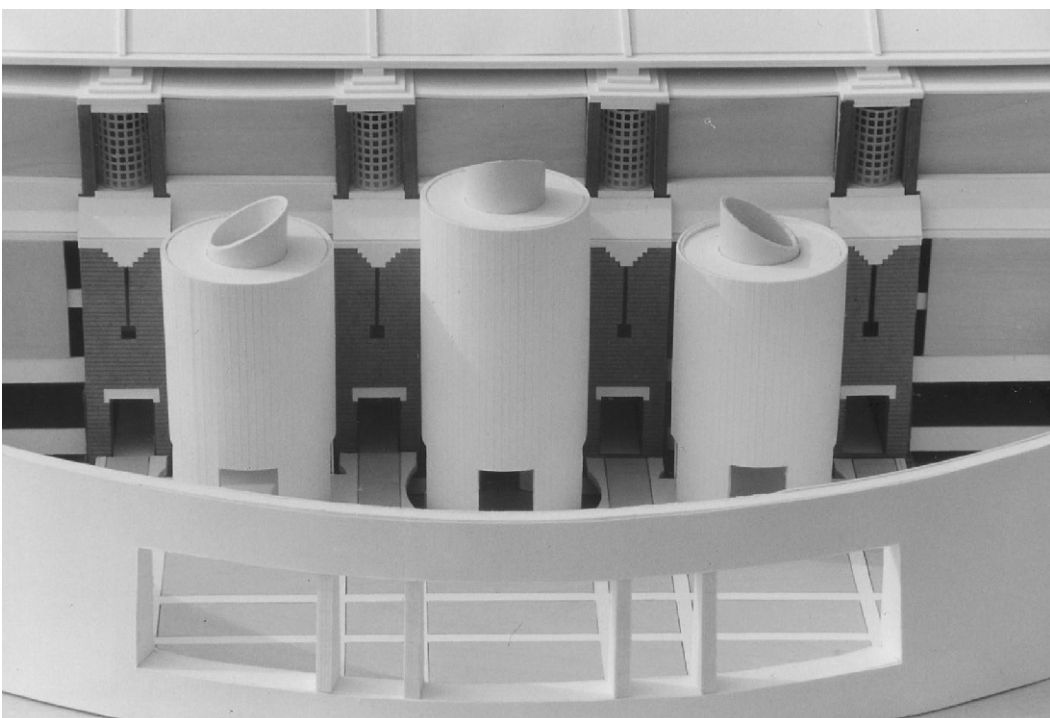


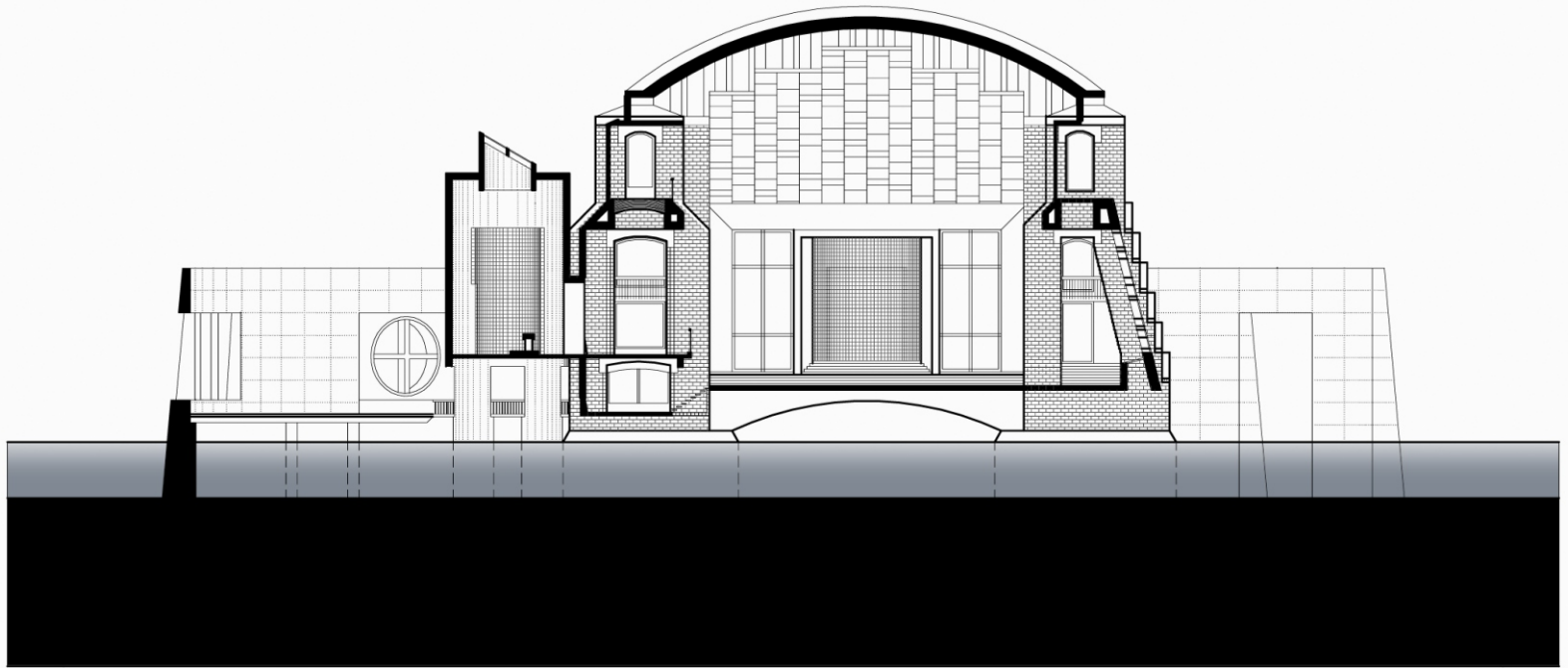
Transverse Section Looking South
