Mozilla Open Source Support (MOSS) program has created a COVID-19 Solutions Fund and is **accepting applications on an ongoing basis for projects up to \$50,000 that respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in some way**. MOSS is accepting applications for hardware and software projects including software that solves secondary effects of COVID-19 (e.g. a browser plug in that combats COVID-19 misinformation).
