

MICHAEL SHOCKLEY, APPALACHIAN VICE PRESIDENT




I hope to meet many new people this year and visit FFA chapters across my area and the state. Hope to see you!

ELIZABETH RAMSEY, SENTINEL


Greetings, Virginia FFA! I am Elizabeth Ramsey and I am proud to be serving as the 1998-99 Virginia FFA Association Sentinel.
