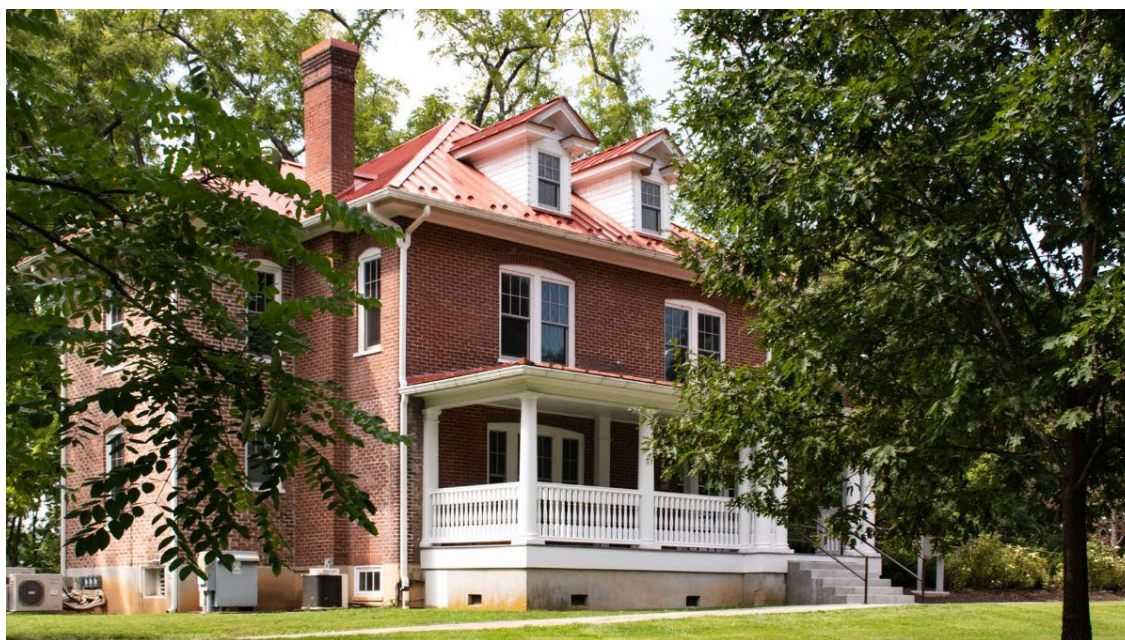

Reminder of ISCE Support for Investigator-initiated Research

ISCE accepts unsolicited proposals from full-time T&R and Research faculty anytime during the fiscal year. Typically such requests range from \$3,500 to \$7,500 and are for **projects that require a rapid response to an event, small feasibility studies, and interdisciplinary team building that will lead to the submission of proposals for external grant awards.** Faculty are encouraged to discuss their ideas with ISCE Executive Director, [Karen A Roberto](#) prior to submission. The National Institute on Aging IMPACT Collaboratory was established to build the nation's capacity to conduct pragmatic clinical trials (ePCTs) of non-pharmacological interventions embedded within health care systems to improve the care of people living with Alzheimer's Disease and related dementias and their care partners. **The IMPACT Collaboratory will fund up to two demonstration projects designed as full-scale, Stage IV effectiveness ePCTs that test, measure, and evaluate the effect of a care delivery**

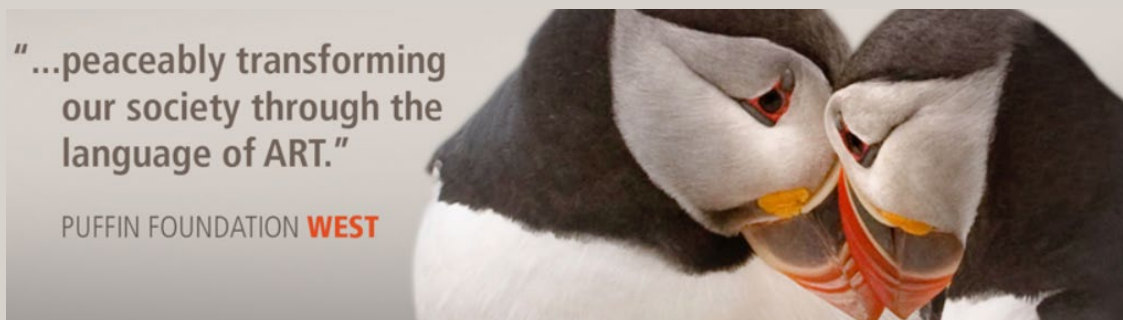
