TO THE STUDENTS

Last year just before graduation a senior student made the statement: "I am just beginning to realize that there are many things going on on this campus for the benefit of Virginians, and I did not know about them soon enough for them to be of maximum benefit to me."

V. P. I. is attempting to serve the State through resident instruction, through research in Agriculture, Science and Engineering, and through Extension Activities in Agriculture.

Tech enrolls students from every county in Virginia, and there are also representatives on the campus from each of the cities of the State. In cooperation with William and Mary College, basic engineering instruction is offered in extension branches in Norfolk and Richmond, and we are maintaining an independent branch at Danville.

Research in Agriculture is conducted on the Blacksburg campus and at ten sub-stations throughout the State. Research in Science and Engineering, while not as extensive as the research in Agriculture, is being conducted for the benefit of industry and business in the Commonwealth.

As the senior student stated, perhaps students should take advantage of the opportunity while here to become acquainted with the various types of activities in which we are engaged, even though all of them do not touch upon the particular curriculum in which the student is enrolled.

As Tech progresses and extends its services, you, as a future alumnus, will benefit by its improvements. By becoming conversant with its many activities at present you will be in a better position to call upon us for services after you leave college and, at the same time, be of greater assistance in helping to acquaint the public with the service that is being rendered.

The purpose of the society is to promote interest in biological research and to afford opportunities for fellowship between students and faculty members in agronomy, animal husbandry, biology, dairy husbandry, and poultry husbandry. Although originally designated as an honorary biological research society, it is now considered as a working guild of biologists interested in research. In effect, election to Phi Sigma is an opportunity for better work, rather than merely election to an honor society.

Although the Block and Bridle Club is primarily an Animal Husbandry organization, there are included in the membership men in many other curriculums.

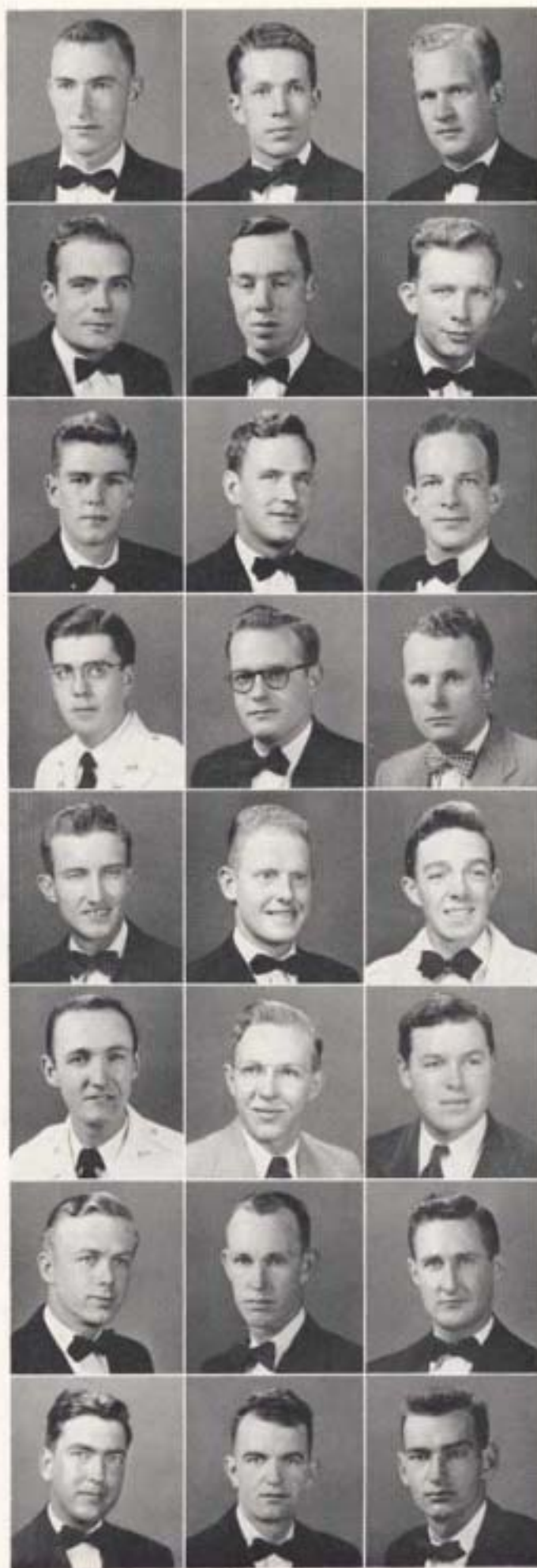

This group exists for the purpose of promoting and advancing interest in the underground, and the fellowship among those engaged in spelunking. Both exploratory and scientific projects are undertaken.

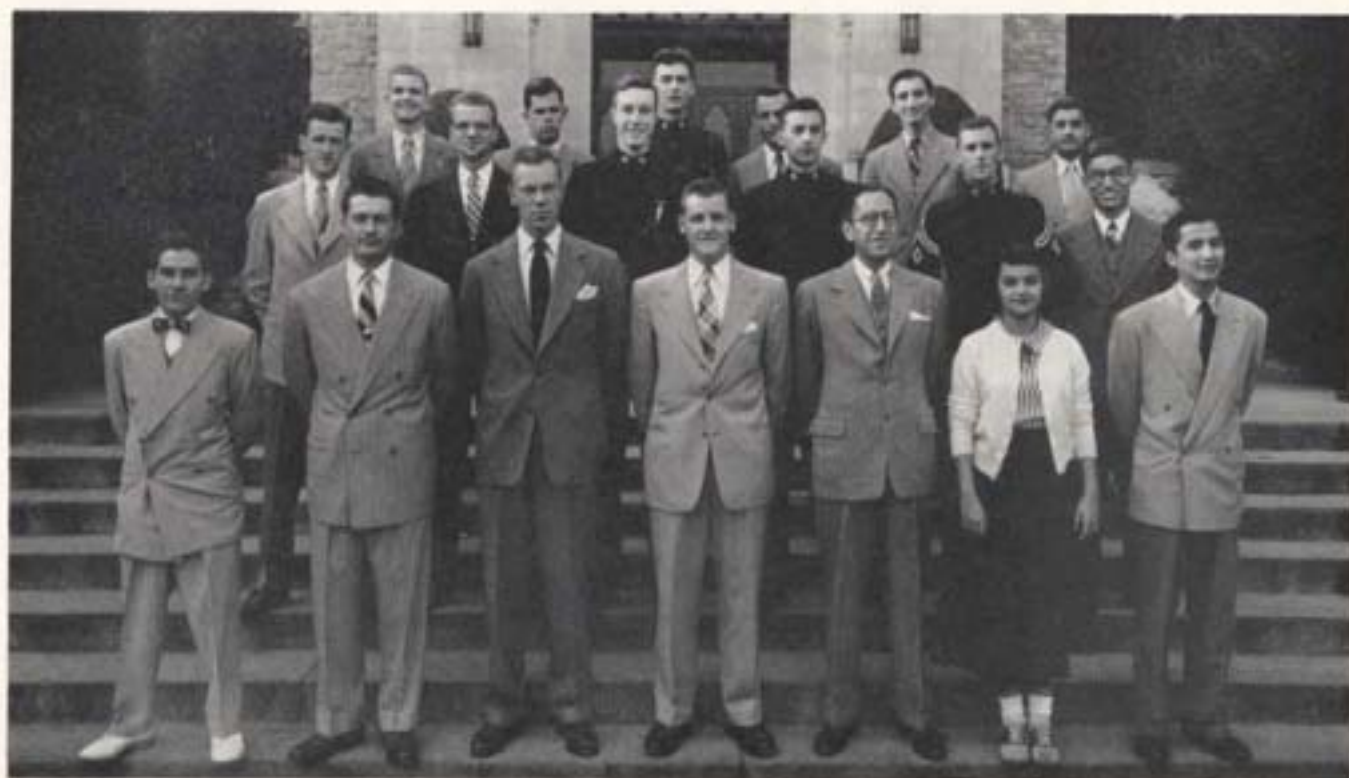

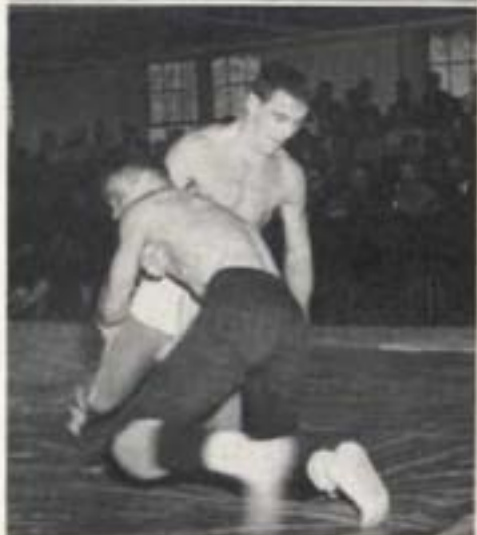
