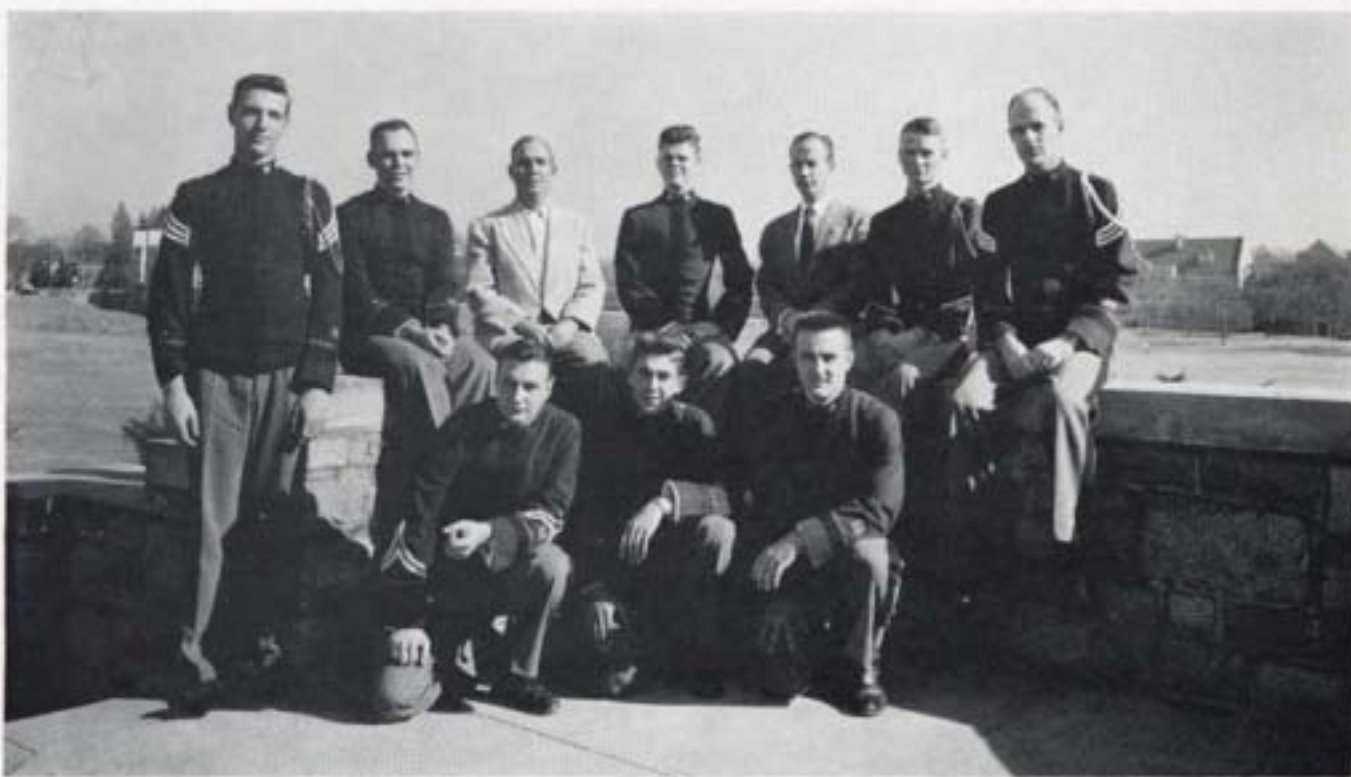
The Hampton Roads Club is composed of students from Newport News, Hampton, Phoebus, Bull Island, Williamsburg, and surrounding territories.

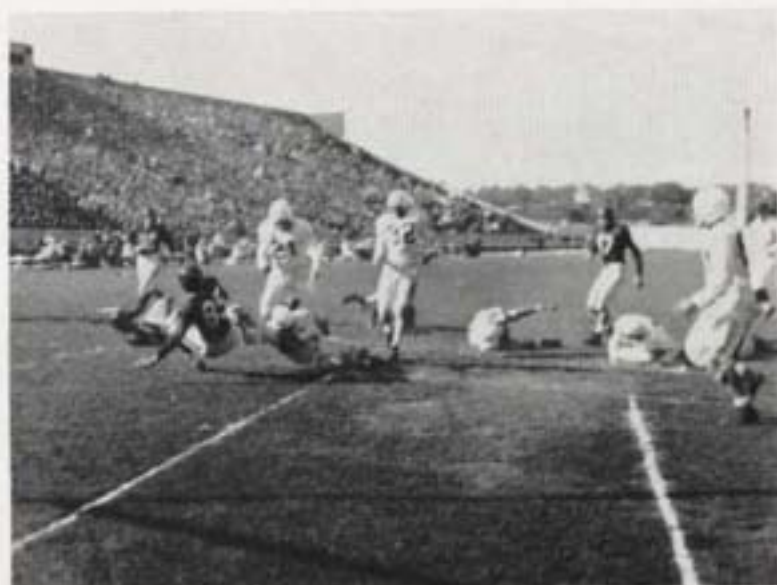

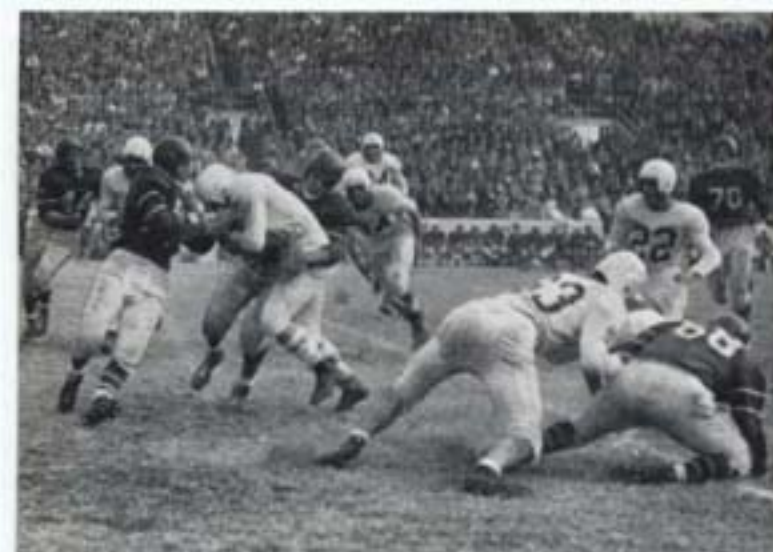

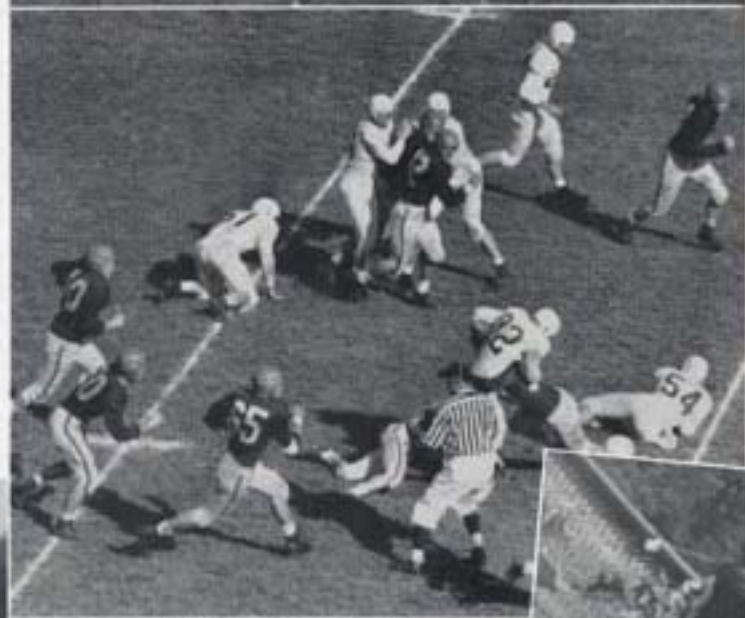

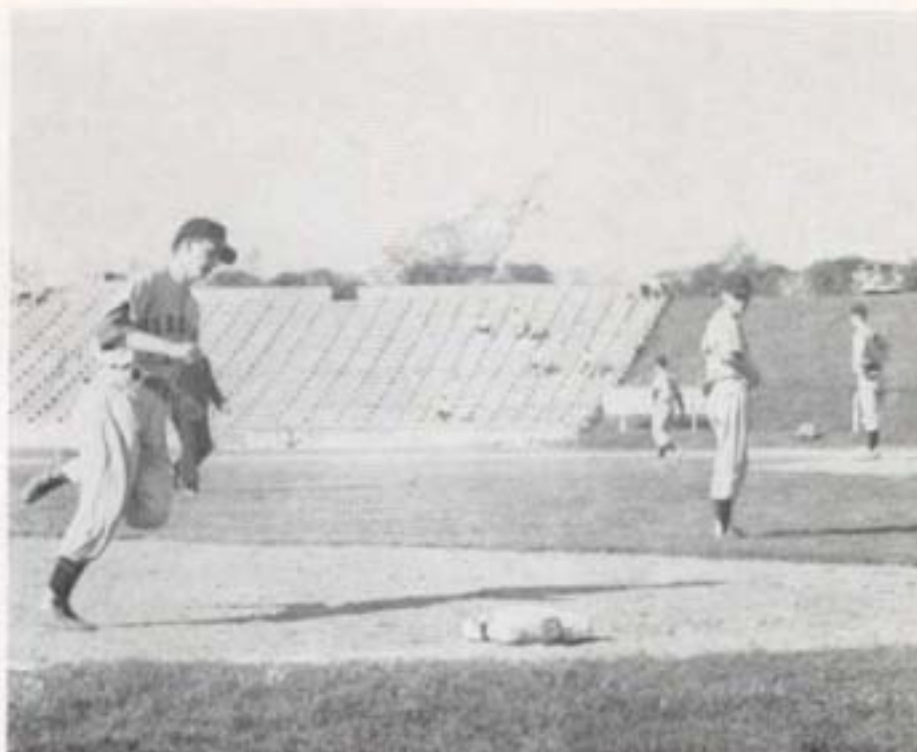
Outfielder Tommy Bryant achieved honors as he was named to the All-Conference team. Bryant, a slugging outfielder led the team in homers.
