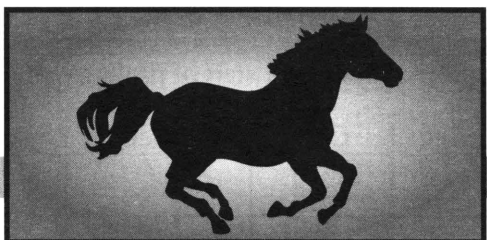


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Horse Management

This may be the only project taken or the member may also enroll in additional 4-H projects including the progressive riding projects. This project may be repeated as many times as desired.

Requirements

1. Belong to the 4-H club program.
2. Select, manage and care for one or more animals. Ownership is recommended but not required. (Note special rules for shows, events, etc.)
3. Follow directions of Project Leaders and Extension Agents.
4. Participate in activities and events related to the project.
5. Keep an accurate and up-to-date record book.
