- The Wood Based Composites Center Fall 2007 Industry Advisory Board Meeting and Technical Forum will be held Wednesday and Thursday, October 3-4, 2007 at the University of Maine, Orono, ME.
- November 29th the department faculty are invited to participate in a regional discussion and planning conference in Southside. This event is being planned by the regional partnership to bring WoodLINKS USA and educational programming to the high schools, community colleges, Higher Education Center, and Virginia Tech. - Please join us for Graduate Seminar on Wednesday's at 2:30 pm in the Brooks classroom. Seminar is open to all faculty and staff and this is a good way to interact with our graduate students. There will be graduate student presentations near the end of the semester. Our speaker this week is Dr. Dan Hindman, who will be presenting an overview of his research program.

This is a visit scheduled as a mini-portion of a sabbatical leave for Dr. Damery.
