Curriculum Materials Approved by CUC Thursday April 6

All pending department curriculum changes were passed by the Commission on Undergraduate Curriculum on Thursday afternoon. There are no other pending department curriculum issues pending.

Those items approved include:

- A new department minor in Packaging Science (this stands alone on the campus)
- Approval of new option Wood Structures and Materials (this completes all 6 new options)
- Change course number WOOD/FOR 3784 to WOOD 2784 World Forestry and Forest Products
- Change course numbers for WOOD 4315/4316 to WOOD 3315/3316 as a sequence. Also change credit hours of Wood 3315 from 2 to 3 credits.

- Approve new course WOOD 3224 – Packaging and Materials Handling was approved with changes; those changes incorporated to include page numbers on suggested text, changes in verbiage per the hand written notes on the original submission
- Approve new course WOOD 2124 Wood Structure and Properties (drop WOOD 3114 Wood Structure, Processing and Properties)
- Approve new course Wood 3124 Paper and Paperboard Packaging – the prereq was changed to WOOD 2124 Wood Structure and Properties (which was approved at the 2/16/06 CUC meeting).
- Approve new course Wood 4024 Packaging Dynamics for Distribution – prerequisites addressed and appropriately changed to WOOD 3224 Packaging and Materials Handling. Justification on prerequisites added.
- All new checksheets are now available on the department website for download. There are no new curriculum issues pending for the department.
