Liguang Wang was born in Xinjiang, northwest China in June 1977. In 1988, he went for middle school in Sichuan Province, southwest China. He entered the Minerals Engineering Undergraduate Program at Central South University in Changsha, Hunan Province in September 1994. One month later, he was selected to the Education Reform Class (ERC) of the university for a two-year special academic training. In 1996, he was among 25 students who were qualified to attend the graduation ceremony of the ERC class. He obtained his Bachelor's Degree in Minerals Engineering in June 1998. In September 1998, he enrolled in the Minerals Engineering Graduate Program at Central South University. His thesis focused on iron ore agglomeration and he obtained his Master's Degree in 2001. He entered the Ph.D. program at the Department of Mining and Minerals Engineering at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in August 2001. He was a visiting student at the Max-Planck Institute of Colloids and Interfaces, Golm, Germany in 2002.

During his doctoral studies, he has published five journal papers and several conference papers. He won the Pratt Fellowship from the College of Engineering at Virginia Tech. He also won the Outstanding Graduate Student Award from the Department of Mining and Minerals Engineering. He was a recipient of the Travel Scholarship from the Centenary of Flotation Symposium, Brisbane, Australia.
