Daniel Armando Liut was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina on March 25th 1962. He completed his elementary and high school education at the John Baptist Berthier Institute in Buenos Aires. In 1980 he entered the Argentine Naval Academy (Escuela Naval Militar [E.N.M.]) from where he graduated five years later after completing a six-month training trip in the tall ship A.R.A. Libertad. In 1985 he was assigned to the aircraft carrier A.R.A. 25 de Mayo. In 1986 he entered the Technological Institute Buenos Aires (Instituto Tecnológico Buenos Aires [I.T.B.A.]) and three years later the Air University (Universidad del Aire) of the Argentine Air Force, in Córdoba, Argentina. There he obtained a B.S. in Aeronautical Engineering in 1991. From 1992 to 1993 he served at the Naval Airforce Maintenance Center (Taller Aeronaval Central [T.A.C.]) where he was in charge of the Military Personnel Division, six of the maintenance shops and a technical school. In the fall of 1993 he began his graduate studies at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, in Blacksburg, Virginia, for a Master's degree in the Engineering Science and Mechanics Department. He completed his degree one year later and returned to Argentina. There he served as an Assistant to the Commander of the Technical Department of the Aeronautical Maintenance Headquarters of the Argentine Naval Aviation, Edificio Libertad, Buenos Aires, Argentina, until he retired from the navy. In the fall of 1995 he returned to the U.S. to finish his Ph.D. in Engineering Mechanics at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University.
