1. Arrange accommodation soon

This comprises a set of over 4000 spectrum measurements concerning the 400MHz-500MHz band and a Matlab script. The spectrum measurements were captured in the conference venue during March by Tom and I. The Matlab script creates a 3D plot of the spectrum measurements and may be developed further to help you test your demonstrations using real and relevant spectrum usage data before arriving in Chicago. An example plot is also included in this pack. The licenced demonstrations frequency range is highlighted on this plot.

This pack requires Matlab and is available as .zip and .tar.gz versions for both Windows and Linux variants.

Details of the FCC special temporary authority licence have also been published on the webpage.
