EMERGENCE

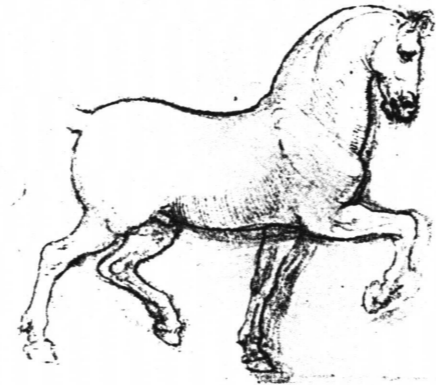
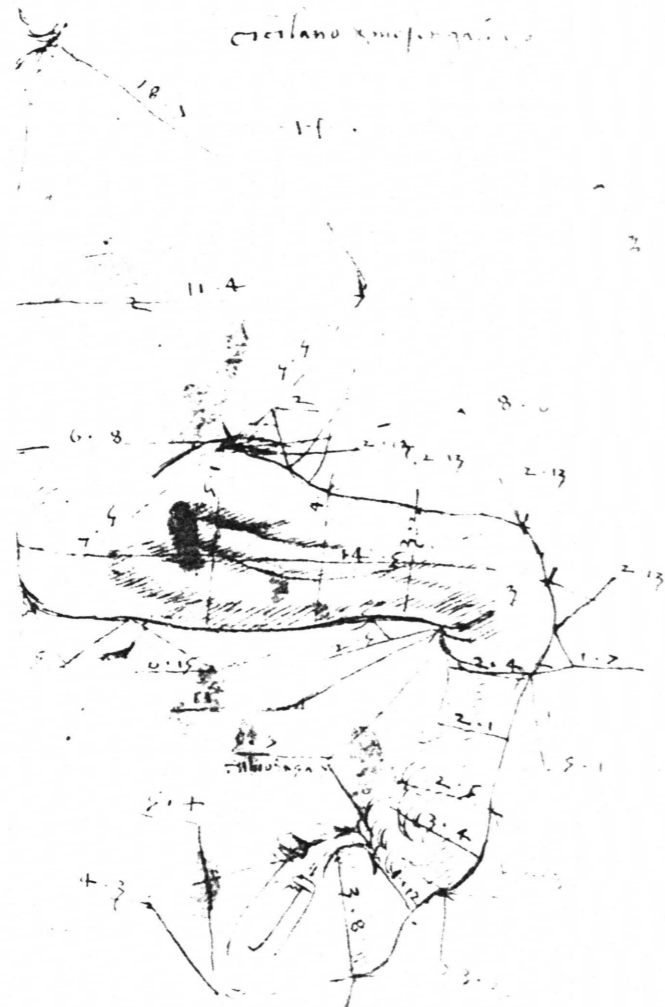
Excellently scented, the horses,

What ennobles us is this watching

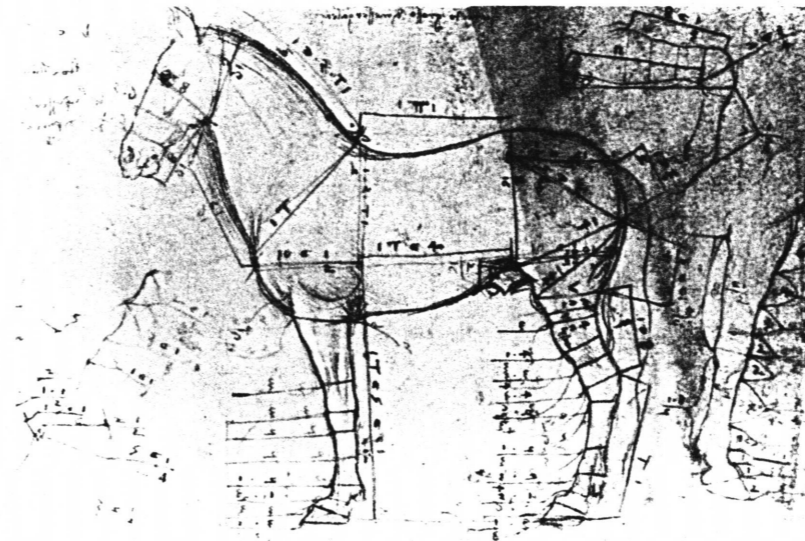

For the epiphanal landscape.

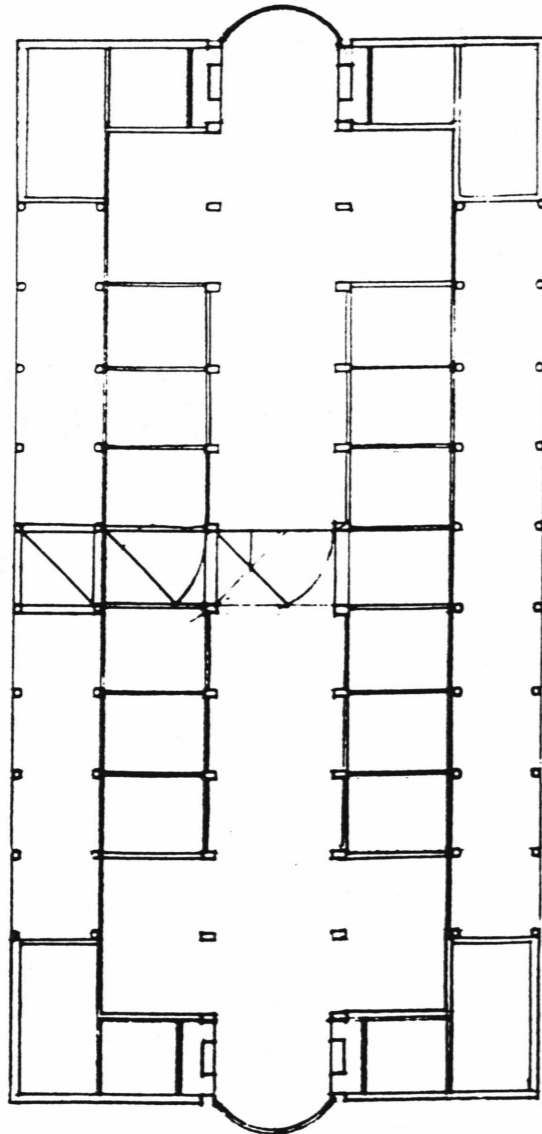
