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Introduction

This form is for the organization of farm data to be analyzed by the CMN Farm Business Analysis System. Financial analyses and efficiency factors are calculated for the farm. Two analyses may be obtained. The first analysis is for the calendar year for which the data applies. These data are stored on a computer so that a farm progress report may be produced after several years of data are accumulated.

This revision includes the addition of state codes (FIPS). Refer to the FRMDATA User Guide for FIPS codes. Also included are rice, cotton, and sugar cane in Table 8.

Crop input is divided into two sections - single crops and double cropping of the same land. Do not enter double-cropped acreage in the single crop input section and avoid double counting crops in the two input sections.

Land Resource Areas are included as a restricted code. You have been given the codes if they apply. Enter a "No" to the question if you do not have a code.

Individual farm information is protected against disclosure to others. Farm code numbers are assigned to each farm with only the person assigning the codes and the farmer knowing the identity of the farmer. Access to individual data files is restricted.

The source of data may be any record keeping system, CPA, account book, or other record keeping system containing the needed data. The worksheets on pages 11 and 12 are for your use in organizing livestock inventories and feed allocations. You may prefer to use another method of calculating animal months. These numbers are entered in Table 6 and Tables 10 through 15.

Include GROSS VALUES for sales and purchases. Hauling, commissions, deductions for supplies and/or dues or check-offs, marketing charges, etc., should be recorded in the appropriate expense category.

The farmer should keep this form for future reference.
