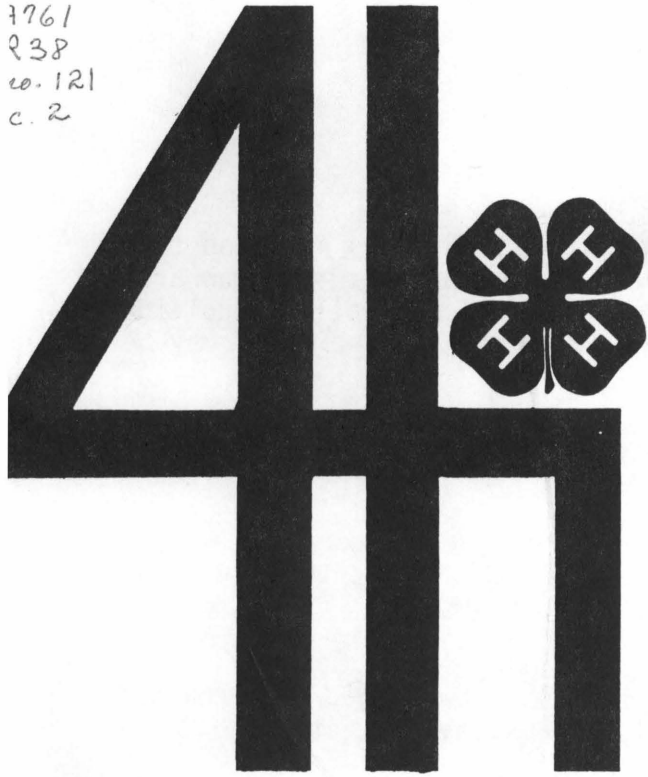


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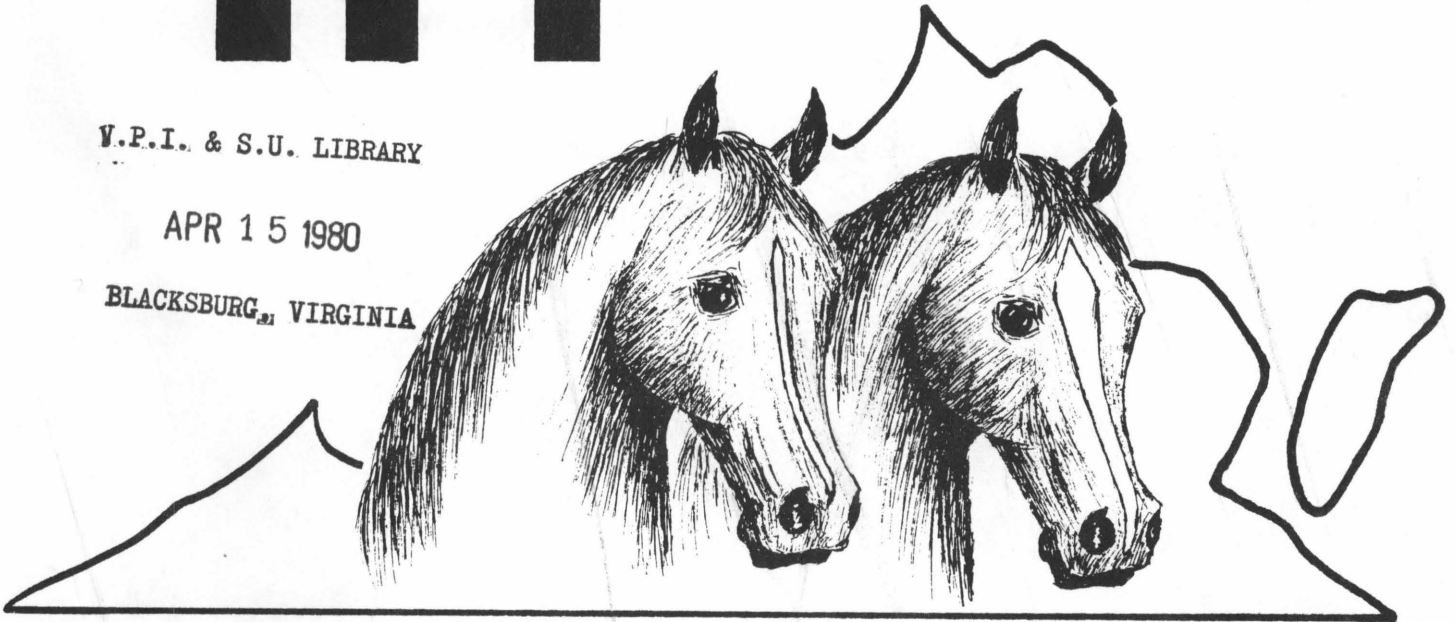

5. Keep an accurate and up-to-date record book.
