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FIRST-YEAR GARDENING PROJECT

This beginning gardening project is for club members that have a small section of ground that is theirs alone to tend, separate from the rest of the family garden. This small section may be along the edge of the yard, may be quite small, but should not be larger than about 30 by 30 feet or larger than 1,000 square feet in size, for the first-year project.

Suggested Requirements:

1. Give size of your garden.
2. Grow from two to six different vegetables.
3. Learn to identify four harmful weeds.
4. Learn to identify four insects, beneficial or harmful.
5. Learn about gardening costs by keeping a record of expenses.
6. Return this completed project book to your 4-H leader when completed.
