

I. Annual Report Executive Summary, 2008-09

Department of Psychology

Learning: Undergraduate

- The Department offered classes serving our growing 1000+ majors and second majors, along with seven Area 3 core courses serving the broader university.
- There were 274 enrollments in field study and undergraduate research courses representing individualized work on research projects and in community agencies.
- Elena Polejaeva, a graduating senior, was named the 2009 Outstanding Psychology Senior.
- Four psychology majors received 2009 Research Awards: Sabrina Hu, Katherine Leonberger, Megan Lyons, and Elena Polejeva.

Learning: Graduate

- The Clinical, Industrial/Organizational, and Developmental and Biological Psychology doctoral programs had over 70 graduate students.
- 14 students received the Ph.D and 17 students received the M.S. during 2008-09.
- 3 students received clinical internships at highly selective research institutions.
- Brenda Salley was awarded an American Psychological Foundation Elizabeth Musterberg Koppitz Graduate Fellowship.
- Rachel Moore won the student poster award for her presentation at the International Society of Traumatic Stress Studies annual meeting.
- Kacey Morasch was the recipient of the 2008 Dissertation Award from the International Society for Developmental Psychobiology (ISDP).
- 27 graduate students received external and internal research and travel awards to support their research presentations at national and international conferences.
- 15 new graduate students accepted admission offers for August 2009 with impressive qualifications (Mean Undergraduate GPA=3.6, GRE-V=575, GRE-Q=701).

Discovery

- The faculty and graduate students were authors on 38 peer-reviewed journal articles published in 2008 with another 40 articles in press at the end of the 2008.
- The faculty also published 19 book chapters with another 21 chapters in press and they were authors on numerous other published abstracts, technical reports, and brief research reports.
- 10 faculty received a total of over 1.4 million dollars in new externally-funded research awards; total research expenditures for the fiscal year were in excess of 2.1 million dollars
- Two postdoctoral associates were funded on research grants.
- The Department sponsored or co-sponsored 8 colloquia and workshops given by national and international scholars.
- Bethany Bray was successfully recruited as an Assistant Professor to begin in 2009-10 with a specialty in quantitative methods.
- Martha Ann Bell, Ph.D. was appointed Editor of the journal *Infancy*.

- Kirby Deater-Deckard, Ph.D. was appointed to Fellow status in the Association for Psychological Science.
- E. Scott Geller, Ph.D. was the recipient of the 2009 Gold Medal Award for Life Achievement in Psychology in the Public Interest by the American Psychological Foundation Board of Trustees.
- Tom Ollendick, Ph.D. became the president-elect for the Society for a Science of Clinical Psychology
- Robin Panneton, Ph.D. received a Fulbright Research Chair award at the Centre for Research in Language, Mind, and Brain, McGill University in Montreal, Canada
- Richard Winett was appointed as an expert reviewer for the National Cancer Institute's initiative for Transdisciplinary Research on Energetics and Cancer (TREC)

Engagement

- The Psychological Services Center and Child Study Center provided psychological services to over 100 local community residents.
- Faculty were editors or associate editors of 4 peer-reviewed journals and were on editorial boards of 31 additional peer-reviewed journals.
- Lee Cooper was elected to a two-year term as the President of the Blue Ridge Academy of Clinical Psychologists (BRACP), a regional academy of the Virginia Academy of Clinical Psychologists (VACP).
- Russell T. Jones was named to the Disaster and Technical Assistance Center subcommittee in the Department of Health and Human Services.

Diversity

- Several faculty were actively involved in McNair, MAOP, and VTPREP programs to promote the recruitment and success of minority students at both the graduate and undergraduate levels.
- The Department supported a chapter of the Association of Black Psychologists and contributed financial support to the Black Graduate Student Organization for its annual Ebony Affair celebrating diversity in our community.
- Three faculty sit on College of Science or University Committees promoting diversity among the students and faculty.
- An incoming minority graduate student, Jordan Booker, was awarded the Powell fellowship by the Graduate School for 2009-10
