Most colleges offer a variety of programs and services to the entire student body. Some of the universities and colleges in Virginia have services which are designed with specific orientation for persons with handicaps. Some of these services may include:

- Mobility Aids - Location assistance, such as maps showing barrier free routes for persons in wheelchairs; tactile or auditory maps for blind persons; or "walk-throughs" to familiarize the student with the easiest ways to get around campus.
- Counseling and Therapies (specified for each college)
- Study Aids and Equipment - Interpreters; notetakers; Braille and tape facilities; teletypewriters; equipment repair service; equipment loan or rental service.
- Accessibility Modifications - Barrier free adaptations have been made to some of the existing buildings to allow greater access.

EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES FOR CHILDREN
WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES

Special learning disabilities may be noted in a child who exhibits a disorder in one or more basic psychological processes involved in understanding or in using spoken or written languages. These disabilities may be expressed through disorders of listening, thinking, talking, reading, writing, spelling, or arithmetic. CHILD DEVELOPMENT CLINICS

The Bureau of Child Health of the Virginia State Department of Health conducts thirteen regional child development clinics. These clinics serve children suspected of developmental disorders including developmental delay and specific developmental discrepancies.

A comprehensive pediatric developmental evaluation for children ages 0 to 21 is determined by a multidisciplinary staff consisting of a pediatrician, psychologist, nurse and social worker. Plans for a treatment program are developed and implemented in cooperation with the parents; the family doctor, and other appropriate facilities, such as the school and local health department.
