EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES FOR CHILDREN WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES

Special learning disabilities may be noted in a child who exhibits a disorder in one or more basic psychological processes involved in understanding or in using spoken or written languages. These disabilities may be expressed through disorders of listening, thinking, talking, reading, writing, spelling, or arithmetic. CHILD DEVELOPMENT CLINICS

The Bureau of Child Health of the Virginia State Department of Health conducts thirteen regional child development clinics. These clinics serve children suspected of developmental disorders including developmental delay and specific developmental discrepancies.

A comprehensive pediatric developmental evaluation for children ages 0 to 21 is determined by a multidisciplinary staff consisting of a pediatrician, psychologist, nurse and social worker. Plans for a treatment program are developed and implemented in cooperation with the parents; the family doctor, and other appropriate facilities, such as the school and local health department.
