

Archivist's Report, 2016

International Archive of Women in Architecture (IAWA)

Overview

Throughout 2016, Special Collections continued its joint partnership with the College of Architecture and Urban Studies to acquire, arrange, describe, provide access to, and promote IAWA collections. Because the annual meeting occurs in the spring, the annual archivist's report will cover the previous calendar year with recent updates announced at the business meeting.

Collection Highlights

- During 2016, Special Collections received 20 new IAWA collections or additions to existing collections, totaling nearly 85 cubic feet of material (See Appendix 1, New Collections Received). Highlights include the following:
 - The architectural papers of Trudy Rosen, a pioneering architectural designer and NYU graduate who specialized in office and residential structures throughout the Northeast
 - The architectural papers of Nancy Florence, a California-based artist and residential designer who served as public liaison to the California Architects Florence was a long-time member of the Organization of Women Architects and Design Professionals
 - Textile design portfolio of Lucy Ferrari, Emerita Faculty of the Virginia Tech School of Architecture + Design, which was professionally rebound by a conservator
 - Records of the Women's Development Corporation, a Rhode Island non-profit specializing in creative and efficient residential development for low-to-moderate-income families
- In 2016, 1 new collection was processed and 10 additions were incorporated, comprising 45 cubic feet of material (See Appendix 2 Processed Collections and Additions)
- There are now 390 distinct IAWA collections comprising approximately 1,900 cubic feet
- Purchases supporting IAWA collections and research (See Appendix 3, Purchases)

Research, Promotion, and Selected Uses of IAWA Collections

- Hosted several research appointments with IAWA Study Group members, Bliznakov prize researchers and fellows, and "Fire in the Library" speakers
- Samantha Winn presented a paper on architectural records and the IAWA for the Art Libraries Society of North America, Seattle, March 2016
- Samantha Winn led a session on digital humanities and uses for art and design records for the Art Libraries Society of North America, Seattle, March 2016
- Scans from 29 unique collection were provided to international and local researchers, publishers, and partner organizations

- Prepared 2 library exhibitions and presented 8 formal tours and classes relating to IAWA
- Replied to nearly 50 IAWA related reference questions from researchers in 6 countries
- Added to digital platform (<http://iawa.lib.vt.edu>) to provide online access to selections from IAWA collections
- Regularly updated IAWA website (<http://spec.lib.vt.edu/iawa>)
- Published instructional LibGuide for IAWA collections (<http://guides.lib.vt.edu/iawa>)
- Maintained IAWA Facebook page with frequent postings; reached over 500 likes
- Featured several IAWA related posts on the department blog, “In Special Collections @ Virginia Tech” (<http://vtspecialcollections.wordpress.com/tag/iawa/>)
- Hosted Business Meeting for IAWA Annual Meeting, March 2016

Support for IAWA

- The grant proposal “Women of Design: Revealing Women’s Hidden Contributions to the Built Environment,” was submitted and accepted for the CLIR Hidden Collections Digitization program. The project award of \$232,356 will support two full-time archivists for the two-year grant period. The project will mass-digitize 30 IAWA collections, amounting to approximately 35,000 unique digital items. The material will be accessible and fully searchable through a central web platform. Purcell and Winn are the co-PIs. The project begins in April 2017 and concludes in spring 2019
- Completed several visits with potential donors. Most notable, we began negotiations with Beverly Willis and the Library of Congress to arrange for the donation of her visual materials (approximately 30 boxes of photographs, slides, negatives, and transparencies). Purcell met with Willis at the Library of Congress in spring 2016 and then visited Willis in Connecticut in early summer 2016 to review the collection.
- Several financial donations received (See Appendix 4, Gift and Endowment Accounts)
- Gifts and endowment income used for student wages, archival supplies, and donor travel

Biographical Database

- The IAWA Biographical Database was migrated to a more secure and dynamic platform in 2016. New features include the ability for users to suggest changes and add new entries. Samantha Winn now oversees the IAWA Biographical Database.

Mission and Vision

Our efforts in developing the collections of the IAWA support the department’s mission to build true research collections of manuscripts, books, and images for scholars, students, faculty, and others to use. During the past year interest in IAWA materials, from faculty, students, architects, and scholars, remained steady. IAWA collections are a central part of our collection development efforts, our instructional sessions, and our campus outreach efforts. The upcoming CLIR grant will significantly expand the online presence of IAWA.
