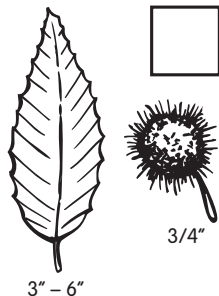

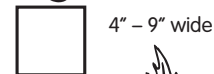

Identify the tree leaves and fruits pictured on this sheet. Place the correct tree number in the box above each leaf and fruit.

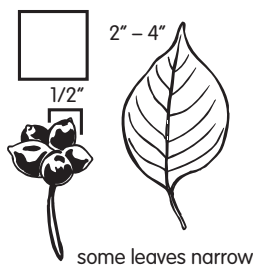
