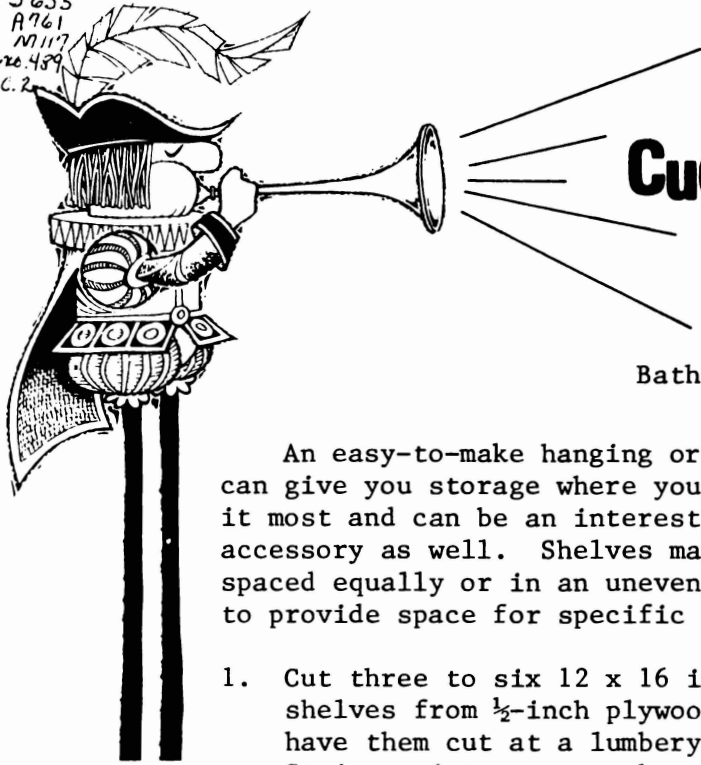


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Cue Sheet

Bathroom Organizer

An easy-to-make hanging organizer can give you storage where you need it most and can be an interesting accessory as well. Shelves may be spaced equally or in an uneven pattern to provide space for specific items.

1. Cut three to six 12 x 16 inch shelves from 1/2-inch plywood or have them cut at a lumberyard. Stain, paint or wrap the shelves with fabric.
2. Cut two pieces of sturdy fabric 13 inches wide by 12 feet long. Or if you prefer to seam two 6-foot strips from two yards of 54-inch fabric.

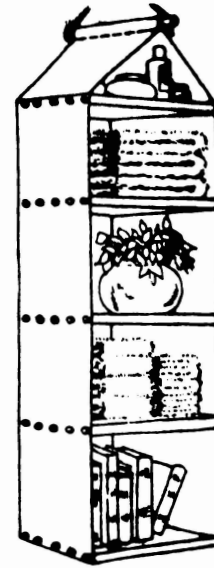
For more body and strength, press on an iron-on interfacing strip before stitching, or slip a fusible web layer in to bond the two layers together after strip is stitched and turned. Stitch the three sides with a 1/2-inch seam allowance. Trim corners and press the seams open. Turn and top press. Turn the ends in and close with stitching or fusing.

3. Fold the strip in half and double stitch a 1 3/4-inch casing.

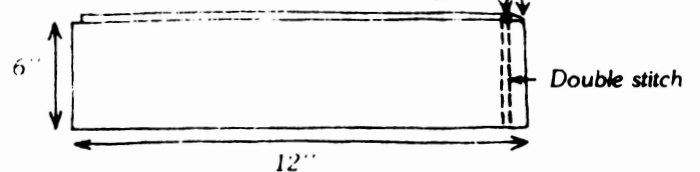

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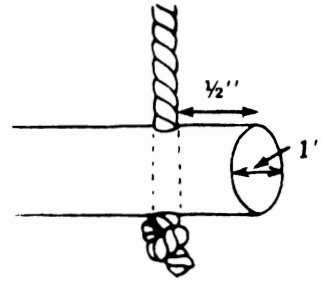
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- 4. Measure 18 inches from the casing stitching and lightly mark a line on each fabric strip (on the inside). Determine the placement of the remaining shelves. Using plain or fancy upholsterer's tacks, tack into the edge of the shelves at about 1 or 2 inch intervals. For bottom shelf, turn the fabric back 3/4 inch over a strip of upholsterer's tape and back through tape and fabric to make a strong smooth finished edge.



- 5. Drill 5/16-inch holes through a 15-inch length of 1-inch wood dowel 1/2-inch from the ends of the dowel. Thread a length of nylon rope through the holes and knot the ends to secure them. (The length of the rope determines how far the unit hangs from the ceiling.)
- 6. Hang your finished unit. Add bath accessories, towels, plants, or magazines.
