




**Policies for Action: Research on Housing Policies that Promote Equity**

**NSF Issues Dear Colleague Letters on COVID-19; also on Robotics**

- **COVID-19:** The National Science Foundation is accepting proposals to **conduct non-medical, non-clinical-care research that can be used immediately to explore how to model and understand the spread of COVID-19**, to inform and educate about the science of virus transmission and prevention, and to encourage the development of processes and actions to address this global challenge.

NSF encourages the research community to respond to this challenge through existing funding opportunities. In addition, they invite researchers to use the Rapid Response Research (RAPID) funding mechanism, which allows NSF to receive and review proposals having a severe urgency with regard to availability of or access to data, facilities or specialized equipment as well as quick-response research on natural or anthropogenic disasters and similar unanticipated events.
