100 YEARS OF WOMEN AT VIRGINIA TECH

Today kicks off the celebration of Hispanic-Latinx Heritage Month. The Women's Center will be collaborating with El Centro to host conversations on the experiences of Latina and Hispanic women.

The first event is a Salary Negotiation workshop on **September 21st at 5PM in El Centro** where we will talk about the gender pay gap and its impacts on Latina and Hispanic women. Then participants will learn how to negotiate for the salary and benefits they deserve.
