

USING THE LEADERSHIP PLANNING GUIDE

This bulletin is designed to help you think through and record your leadership experience: the plan of action; what you did; and, the results. Some guides to help you use this record are:

- 1. Read your project book and this record carefully. This will acquaint you with the desired procedures and requirements.
- 2. With the help of the adult leader with whom you will work or your Teen Advisor, complete early in the year three copies of the sections, "What You Want to Learn" and the "Plan for Action". (Use carbon paper if you wish.) Give the second copy to the adult leader of your leadership group and send the third copy to the Extension Office. This outline of your goals, plan of action, and training needs will help the adult leader and Extension staff members assist you in obtaining the craining that you will need.
- 3. Check your plan often. Make the necessary changes in the plan as needed throughout the year.
- 4. Carry out and evaluate your leadership project. Record your leadership accomplishments regularly.
- 5. Be sure your record includes:
 - a. Your goals
 - b. Your plan of action
 - c. What you actually did
 - d. What you actually learned
 - e. Evidence of your growth in leadership, understanding, and skill
 - f. Your own evaluation of your experience
- 6. In your story tell:
 - a. What you learned about working with younger 4-H members, other members and adult leaders.
 - b. Whether or not you changed your original plan of action. If yes, how and why?
 - c. What things you felt you did well and those things you would do differently another time.
 - d. Any other things you feel you have gained from your experiences as a leader.
- 7. You and your adult leader should evaluate your leadership experience using your written record as a guide.
