

### **Stereo Realist viewer**

**Description:** A device for viewing a “stereoscopic pair” (two images slightly offset from one another to create a three-dimensional effect). Images are printed on 35 mm transparency film and mounted on a “Realist” slide. This viewer was manufactured by the David White Company and likely sold sometime in the 1950s.
