


Figure 78. Stained-glass roundel of the 'Anagogical Window' in the southern bay of the Abbey Church of St. Denis, Twelfth-century. Paris, France.




Figure 79. Franz Marc, *Die Füchse* (The Foxes), 1913. Kunstmuseum Düsseldorf, Germany.




Figure 84. Kurt Schwitters, *Mz. 448. Moskau*, (Mz. 448. Moscow), 1922. The Museum of Modern Art, New York, USA.




Figure 86. Kurt Schwitters, *Ohne Titel: Merzbild Rossfett* (No Title: Merz Picture Horse Fat), 1920. Private Collection.




Figure 89. Kurt Schwitters, *Merzsäule* (The Merz-column), 1920. Destroyed.




Figure 91. Kurt Schwitters, *Hanover Merzbau*: General view of 1923 *Der erste Tag Merz-säule*, photographed c. 1930. Destroyed.




Figure 92. Kurt Schwitters, *Hanover Merzbau*: Detail view showing 1923 *Der erste Tag Merz-säule*, photographed c. 1930. Destroyed.




Figure 94. Peter Zumthor, Plan of *Thermal Bath House*, Vals, Switzerland, 1998.
