1. Announcements

1. Dr. Sullivan reminded the Commission that the meetings in April have been designated for the Budget Board. The Commission will meet as often as necessary to resolve Budget Board recommendations.
2. Dr. Sullivan requested that student leaders discuss whether or not to continue student leader meetings during spring quarter and report back on their recommendation at the next Commission meeting.
3. Dr. Sullivan introduced Mrs. Betty Eaton who serves as her secretary and will be serving as secretary to the Commission.

2. Adoption of Agenda

1. A motion was introduced and approved to adopt the agenda.
3. Approval of the Commission Minutes of March 12, 1987.
 1. The Minutes of March 12, 1987 meeting were approved as written.

4. New Business

1. In successive motions, the Commission filed the minutes of the following meetings:

Student Media Board of February 25, 1987
Student Media Board of March 7, 1987
Student Budget Board of March 11, 1987
Student Constitutional Affairs Board of March 11, 1987

2. Mr. Campion expressed appreciation to Dr. Knocke and Dr. Hillison for serving as faculty representatives to the Budget Board during budget hearings.

Mr. Campion reviewed the 1987-88 budget recommendations for student organization funding. The Budget Board received \$400,000 to allocate to student organizations for 1987-88. Organizations receiving the major increases in funding were: Black Student Alliance; NAACP; Corps of Cadets; and, the Graduate Student Assembly. The Budget Board recommended that the VTU and Honor System receive reduced allocations during 1987-88.

The VTU will not have as extensive programming during 1987-88 as in previous years because of the closing of Squires and the Honor System requested less funds than in previous years.

Mr. Campion reviewed the guidelines used by the Budget Board to recommend allocations to student organizations and reviewed the criteria for appealing a Budget Board recommendation. Mr. Campion reminded the Commission that the fact that the Budget Board did not fund an item at the requested level does not, in itself, constitute grounds for an appeal. Appeals must be submitted to the Commission Secretary, 312 Burruss Hall, by 5:00 p.m., Friday, April 3, 1987.

In the event that an appeal is filed, the Commission will meet Thursday, April 9, 1987, to vote on whether to hear the appeal. Should the Commission vote to hear an appeal, the organization would be invited to present at the next meeting of the Commission. After the presentation by the organization, the chair of the Student Budget Board would respond to the information presented. On the basis of the information presented by the organization and by the chair of the Student Budget Board, the Commission would decide whether to grant the appeal, how much of the amount appealed would be restored and where the restored amount will be taken from the total budget of \$400,000.

5. Announcements

1. Dr. Sullivan distributed the application packet for Student Budget Board membership. Applications are due Friday, April 17, 1987, 5:00 p.m., 215 Squires. Candidate presentations before the

Commission are tentatively scheduled Thursday, April 23, 1987. This date is dependent upon the Commission's vote on the Budget Board recommendations for student organization funding.

2. Ms. Pollard introduced the newly-elected Panhellenic Council President, Meg Tomlison.
3. Mr. Beck requested that the Commission receive information in writing or through a presentation before the Commission concerning the total allocation of Student Center fees for 1986-87. Mr. Beck stated that though the students could see how \$400,000 of Student Center fees were allocated through the Budget Board, it would be helpful to see how the total Student Center fee monies were allocated.
4. Cadet Colonel Smith introduced Brian Stockmore, 1987-88 Regimental Executive Officer, and Cecil Jacobs, 1987-88 Regimental Finance Officer.
5. The meeting adjourned at 5:00 p.m.
