



VIRGINIA FOREST LANDOWNERS' EVENTS CALENDAR VIRGINIA FOREST FACTS

- 61% (15.4 million acres) of the state is forested.
- Non-industrial private landowners own 77% of Virginia's forestlands.
- Landowners earned \$196 million for their timber in 1993.
- Timber and other wood products contributes \$9.7 billion annually to Virginia's economy.
- Forest recreation (e.g., fishing, wildlife watching, and hunting) contributes \$1.8 billion annually to Virginia's economy.
- Virginia's forest resource supports one of the largest manufacturing industries in the state ranking:
 - First in employment
 - Second in wages
 - Fourth in value added
