Jennifer Million called the meeting to order at 11:02 a.m. A quorum was present.

#### 1. Adoption of agenda and approval of May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025 minutes

#### 2. New Business

Diane Agud discussed concerns regarding the crosswalks near the bookstore/traffic circle on Kent Street as well as between McBryde and Torgersen; Diane discussed how backed up traffic gets due to the large amounts of students in the crosswalks and it sets the busses behind.

Diane also brought up a question from last AY regarding the feasibility of installing a monitoring system to indicate when the NEC garage is full; Carrie Cox advised on the matter and seeing as how the technology would not update correctly it would not be feasible or fiscally sound to install one at this time.

#### 3. Mobility Framework Presentation – Carrie Cox

Carrie Cox updated the committee on the mobility framework; Carrie advised that the website would be up soon for the public to document their issues with campus transportation and problem areas they have experienced. There will also be an e-mail that can be contacted with feedback. Carrie also advised that there will be a transportation survey that everyone should also provide feedback on.

There are stakeholders involved with the mobility framework and if anyone on the committee would voice their concerns to the Chair of the committee, Jennifer Million, she will take the concerns to the mobility framework meetings to make sure they are heard.

There were other concerns voiced such as campus speed limits which Carrie advised would be somewhat related to the mobility framework but not directly; these concerns should also be voiced to the committee chair. The possibility of another parking garage was also brought up, which Carrie Cox addressed that there would not be one right now and advised on a typical timeline for a parking garage. Carrie communicated to continue voicing these concerns especially during this mobility framework, data collected will provide recommendations on how to progress the university towards their transportation and mobility goals.
