

There have always been two carnivals in Trinidad and Tobago - the carnival of the privileged and the jamette carnival, each articulating statements about power to oppress, and resistance to that oppression. With this body of work, Leslie Robertson Toney's photographs explore how Trinbagonians fashioned a creative resistance. Her work examines how the artform of mas(querade) represents a harnessing of joy and rage, a condemnation of oppressors and an emphatic statement of resistance.

Leslie Robertson Toney is a doctoral student in Sociology with a concentration in Women's and Gender Studies, at Virginia Tech. Her current work focuses on the lived experiences of young women and girls in the Caribbean, understanding sexual agency, the impact of migration and issues of health inequality. In her scholarship she utilizes Black, transnational and decolonial feminist frameworks, and she has a background in mental health.

Leslie has spent over a decade as a photographer documenting Black culture, festivals and rituals, most notably Trinidad & Tobago carnival and African spiritual traditions. Her work has been published and exhibited. She considers her photographic style to be journalistic or editorial portraiture.

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT: Brettan O'Beirne

Brettan O'Beirne is the esteemed President of the student-run K-Pop dance group known as, Exodus at Virginia Tech. Brettan has truly made her mark on the Virginia Tech community and her entire group of talented dancers. She has had many amazing experiences that have prepared her for the work she is currently doing. After talking to her about what she has done before coming to Virginia Tech, seeing the work she has done on campus, and what she plans to do in the future, it is safe to say that she has, is, and will continue to embody *Ut Prosim*.



Brettan O'Beirne is a fifth-year senior studying Animal Poultry Science with a triple emphasis in livestock, companion animals, and horses while on the Pre-Vet track. Upon graduation, she plans to work at a vet office or a farm since her course of study offers a wide range of experiences and qualifications.

In addition to Brettans academic commitments and her role in Exodus at Virginia Tech she is also a student volunteer at a horse farm and works at the university's Imaginarium. After speaking with Brettan it is clear that she is accomplished but for this spotlight, we would like to highlight the work and details of Exodus at Virginia Tech while exploring how she got to this point in her life. something revolving age brettan knew that she wanted to pursue something revolving around animals, dance, and performance. So, for extracurriculars back then, Brettan partook in dance classes and just absolutely loved being on stage. But, as much as she liked to dance she loved to sing, just a little bit more.

By the time Brettan started high school her interests of dancing and singing were still a part of her. And it led her to join the show choir at Cosby High School located in Midlothian, VA. At her school she was a part of two of their show choirs: Spotlight and Rhapsody. Through those groups she was able to perform and compete all across the east coast. And after high school Brettan was just grateful to be involved in something that incorporated her love for dancing and singing. Then shortly after those experiences, Brettan got introduced to K-Pop because it was a fusion of her experiences and interests in dance and vocal performance.

Fasting forward, the summer before her first semester, Brettan decided to join Exodus; which was established in 2016. Since Brettan joined the group before most she was able to "find her people," which made her transition into college a lot smoother.



Now, once the semester started going Brettan was a force to be reckoned with. Her very first semester she participated in Exodus's first official music video for their YouTube channel. Which was the first time they had submitted a video for an online dance competition. Then in 2019 Brettan helped run the first intercollegiate K-Pop competition on the east coast where she cleverly named it "Blacksburg K-Pop Pop Off." At this "Pop Off" Brettan and her group had the opportunity to dance beside Alexandra (Alex) Reed, the first

Black K-Pop idol. And saying that those dance experiences were amazing would be an understatement because they were monumentally memorable. Furthermore, the dance Brettan had taught and choreographed was the overall winner and Alex herself helped judge that competition.

Due to Brettans pure talent, drive, and dedication she quickly progressed in her leadership within the group. She began to serve as both an officer and choreographer. Then shortly after the event in 2019 with Alex Reed, she officially became President of Exodus at Virginia Tech.





Throughout her presidency Brettan strives for diversity in talent, race, and experiences. She has learned that there is no way to please everybody and that everything that one does has an impact; whether positive or negative. And this knowledge was then tested when the Novel Coronavirus struck. During the early parts of the pandemic it was extremely hard because the group is all about interaction and performance. Thus, it was extremely difficult to not get on a stage and dance for that long. Especially since right after the spring break of 2020 the group had a spectacular dance showcase ready to go with 25 different songs and numerous wardrobe pieces. But, throughout all of this Brettan and her board members were able to make their time apart as impactful as possible.

And I must say that being back in person, the dance group has been booked and busy! Performing at Gobblerfest, Homecoming, their own November dance showcase, and much more. This group is just truly talented and incredibly lucky to have this month's BCC Student Spotlighter as their President and friend.

Looking ahead, Brettan will be graduating Spring of 2022. And her plan is to stay in the area because there are a lot of job opportunities with animals and farms. While in the area Brettan would like to serve as an advisor for Exodus; as there will be an election process towards the latter part of the Spring 2022 semester to elect the 2022–23 school year Exodus Board.





Now, during the years Brettan was in the dance group... yes, there have been challenges and yes there have been crosswords. But, there has also been joy, triumphant success, and creative authenticity all throughout, Exodus at Virginia Tech. So as Brettan closes this chapter in her life there will be a bookmark

in it for now because she is not fully leaving, she is simply transitioning out and giving space for the many great things the group can do in the semesters and years to come. And by everything that was discussed it is safe to say that this group will be in great hands after her departure!


