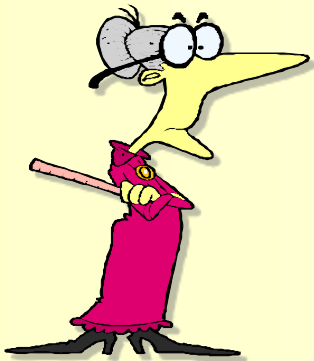

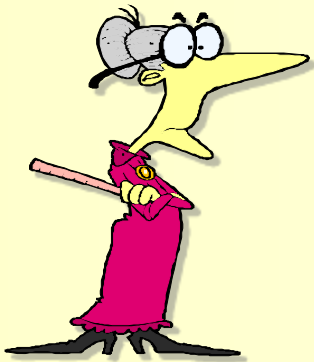

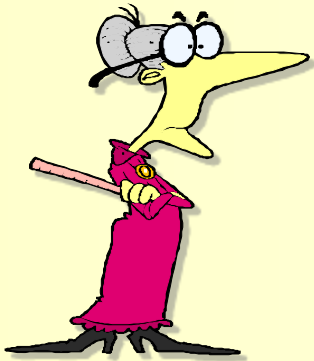
Virginia Tech

- One main library with 2 branches



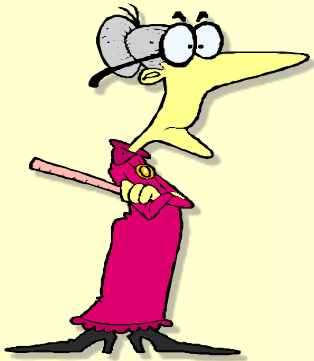

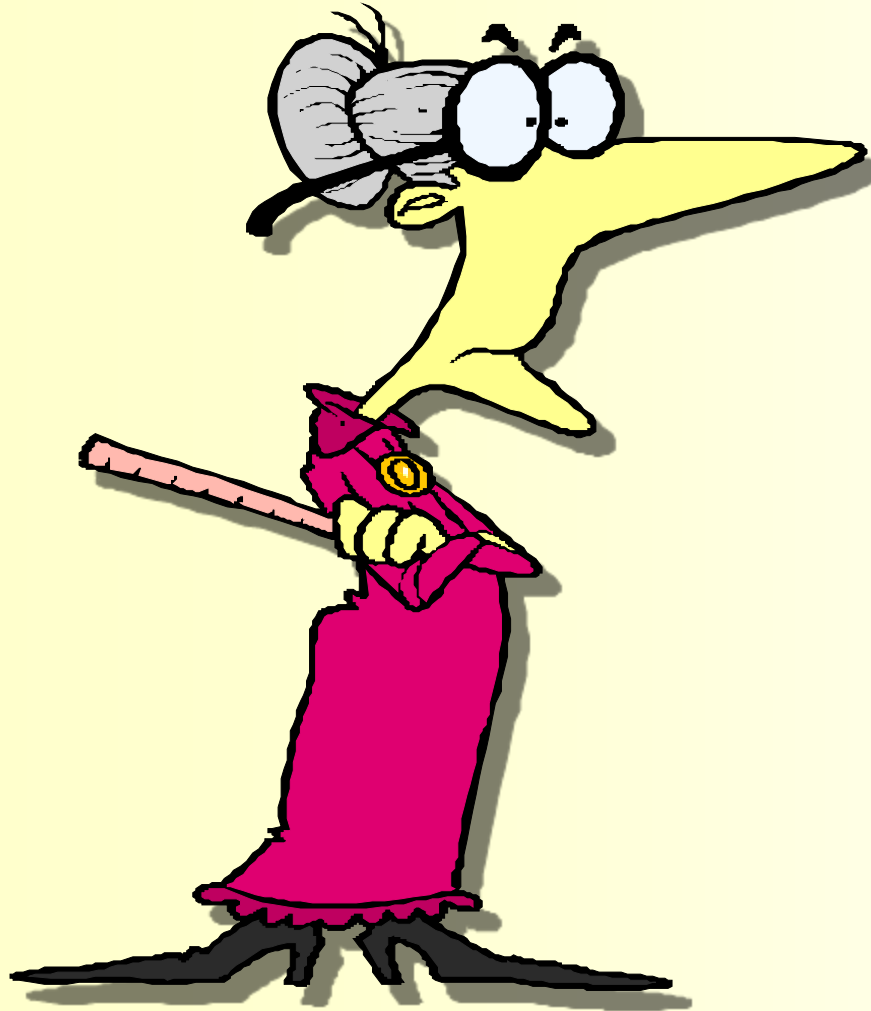

Where to start?

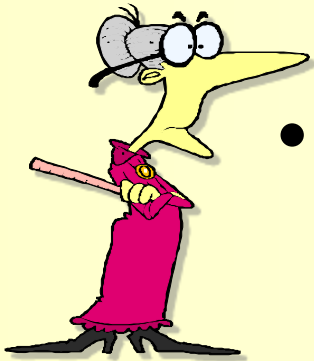
Results of Information Literacy Survey

- 43% understood little of how their high school library was organized
 - less than 1% had ever heard of LC
- 40% had written less than 2 papers in high school
 - 23% of these had never written a paper requiring outside sources



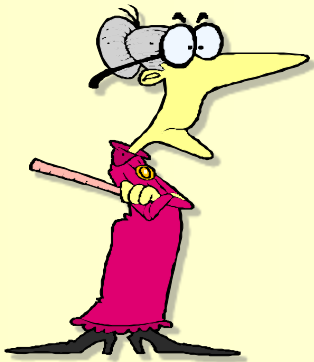
Results of Info literacy Survey

- 48% have less than 2 experiences with electronic databases
- 90% understood copyright procedures and could identify bias and authority as a criterion for evaluating web pages
- Most know purpose of database but have no idea of what a peer reviewed article is



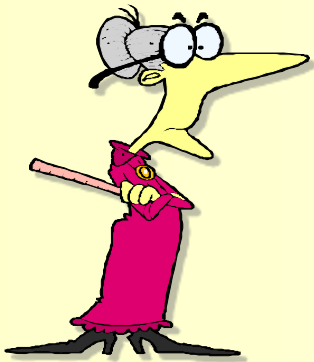
Further Gaps

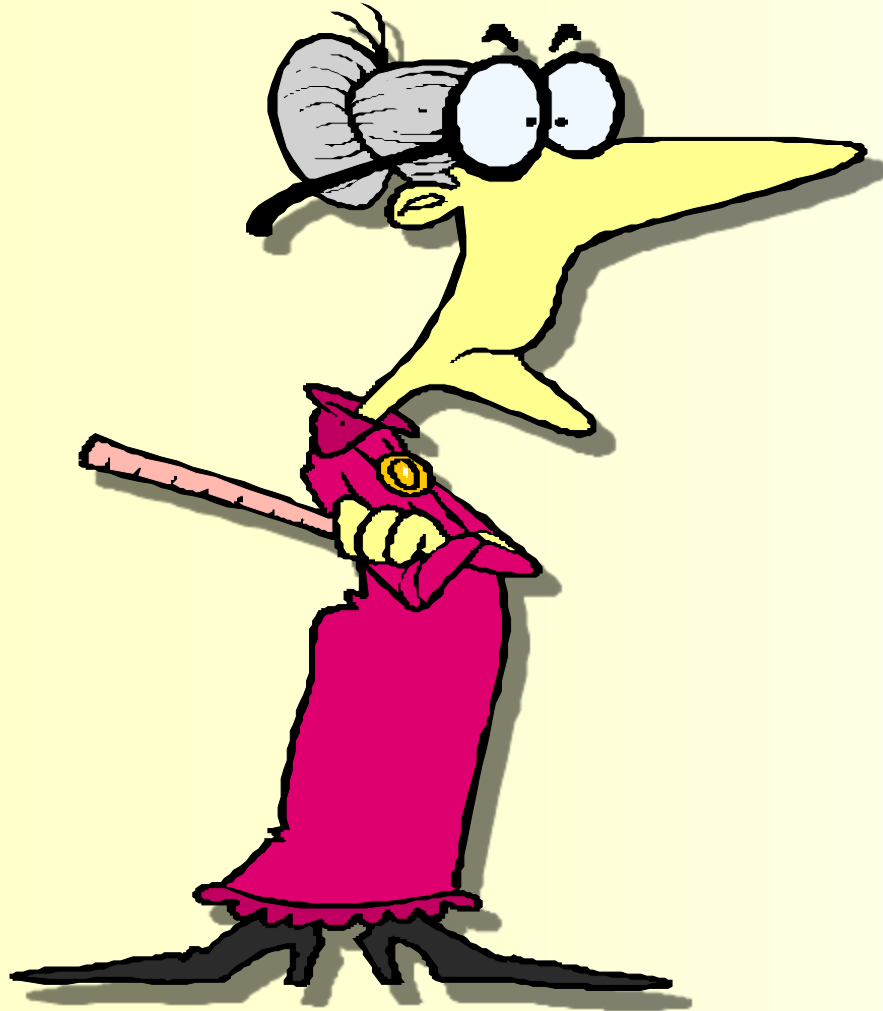
- Serials solutions

Individual articles are not in the catalog; do not search by article title in Addison

B. Paper subscription

Note issues can be found in three locations

Volumes in the Stacks or Storage can be checked out

Current issues do not circulate

C. Use the Request Button to retrieve volumes from the Remote Storage Building

D. Some issues are also available in Microfilm (1st floor)

E. Some issues are also available online

Use the Off-Campus Sign-in button to access online issues when off campus

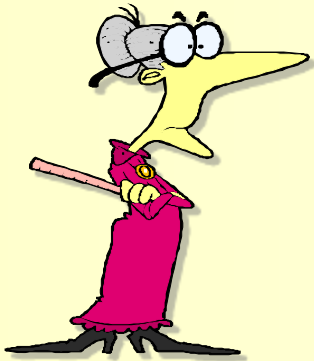

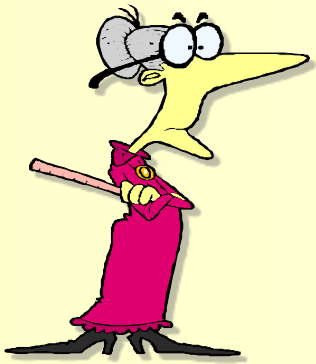
