If you are not interested in sports or joining the school musical, perhaps 4-H has something for you...

Not every student is interested in playing sports, trying out for the school musical, or joining the debate and forensics team. For those students who have yet to find their niche, there is always 4-H.

Most students remember having 4-H enrichment when they were students in the 4th and 5th grades. But 4-H follows students into Middle School, High School and even throughout their adulthood.
