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University operations during winter break

Virginia Tech will be closed for winter break between Thursday, Dec. 24 through Friday, Jan. 1, 2021. University offices will reopen on Monday, Jan. 4. During this time, Dec. 24 and Dec. 25, 2020, and Jan. 1, 2021, represent the designated holiday leave times for eligible faculty and staff. Employees will need appropriate leave types to cover the applicable work hours on the remaining days of winter break - Dec. 28, Dec. 29, Dec. 30, and Dec. 31. For example, the typical full-time employee who works eight hours Monday through Friday will need 32 hours of leave for these days. The most common types of leave used for this period are annual, family personal, compensatory (holiday comp, overtime comp). Sick leave usage would not be applicable unless an employee has a substantiated illness or has doctor appointments.

Information on authorized closings during inclement weather

The safety of the Virginia Tech community is our top priority. In times of inclement weather or other situations, it may be necessary for the university to close or delay opening the Blacksburg, Virginia campus or other campus locations across the state.

Note: These are the only official sources of information for authorized closings and delayed openings for the Blacksburg campus and facilities in the immediate Blacksburg area (excluding off-campus extension offices). As a public service, information will be sent to local media outlets as needed; however, Virginia Tech is not responsible for inaccurate reporting of information on local media outlets.

In the case of inclement weather, employees are responsible for notifying and communicating with their supervisors if and when to report to work that day. If it is not safe for an employee to report to work, they should notify their supervisor.

Because full details of university closings may not be adequately provided or described in other public media, employees are strongly advised to check the University Status page at https://vt.edu/status or one of the other official sources listed above. Note: Authorized closing applies to the Blacksburg, Virginia campus or other specific campus locations across the state. Annual tax document mailings: Employees need to update addresses by Jan. 1. 2021

As the year draws to a close, Payroll and the Commonwealth of Virginia are getting ready for the annual mailing of tax documents, including employee W2s and IRS 1095-C forms. All tax documents will be available electronically or will be mailed to your home address of record by Jan. 31.

We encourage all faculty and staff to review their address and update it, if necessary, by Friday, Jan. 1. While some may access their W2s electronically, the state is required to mail IRS Form 1095-C, which provides information regarding any employer-provided health insurance coverage – or offers of coverage, to your home address of record.

Voluntary COVID-19 testing available for employees week of Dec. 14

Voluntary COVID-19 testing for faculty, staff, and wage employees will be held Monday, Dec. 14 – Friday, Dec. 18. Employees must register for testing in advance using https://vtnotify.students.vt.edu.

VTNotify is a new testing system for both students and employees that uses 2-factor authentication. The site shows the user their most recent negative COVID-19 test and allows the user to schedule a test. The deadline to schedule is 11:59 p.m. the day prior to the test date.

Testing Dec. 14-18 will take place at Schiffert Health Center (2nd floor). Employees should receive their results in 48 to 72 business hours of being tested.

Additional voluntary employee testing will be offered early January. Dates will be published next week. See below for other commonly asked questions.
