SUBJECT: Minutes of the Meeting of Thursday, June 23, 1977

The Commission on Student Affairs met on Thursday, June 23, 1977 at 4:00 p.m. in Room 344 Squires Student Center. The following members were absent: Dean William C. Havard, Dr. Richard Vasey, Dr. Forrest Thye, Dr. N. Alan Shepperd, Mr. Stephen Mathews, Cadet Malcolm D. Tignor, Jr., Mr. Joe VanDenBerg, Mr. Bruce Carrigan, General Earl C. Acuff represented by Mr. Robert Lineen, and Mr. Anthony Jernigan represented by Ms. Barbara Watkins.

Dr. James W. Dean introduced Ms. Kathy Rowe as a new member of the Commission representing the Student Personnel Division.

There were not enough members present at this meeting of the Commission to constitute a quorum. However, since there was a full agenda of items needing immediate attention, the Commission proceeded with this meeting. Any controversy resulting from the actions taken at this meeting will be referred to a quorum of the members of the Commission on Student Affairs. The following items were considered:

1. The minutes of the meetings of May 5, and May 10, 1977 were approved as distributed.
2. The agenda was approved with the following additions, corrections, and deletions:
 - a. Mr. Robert Wagner, representing the Residence Hall Federation and the Horticulture Club, requests permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a mum sale for Homecoming, November 5, 1977. Orders will be taken in the dining halls and at several other campus locations during the two weeks prior to the event. Mums will also be sold the day of the Homecoming game at several locations on campus. Permission for the use of university facilities will be sought from the Office of the Vice President for Administration.

b. Mr. Robert Wagner, representing the Residence Hall Federation, requests permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a watermelon feast on Saturday, July 23, 1977 in the lower quad area of the campus. Permission for the use of university facilities will be sought from the Office of the Vice President for Administration.

c. Mr. Robert Wagner, representing the Residence Hall Federation, requests permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a cookout on Friday, July 8, 1977 on the concrete area between Miles and Barringer Halls. Permission for the use of university facilities will be sought from the Office of the Vice President for Administration.

d. Mr. Robert Wagner requests permission for Genesis to advertise prior to and sponsor a folk Gospel group entitled "Us" to perform on the lower quad area of campus on Wednesday, June 29, and Thursday, June 30, 1977 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Permission for the use of university facilities will be sought from the Office of the Vice President for Administration.

e. Ms. Vicki Takagi, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requests an addition to the 4th of July activities listed in No. 9 of the agenda. The addition would include a fireworks display to be held at 9:30 p.m. on the drillfield. The concert on the drillfield will be held from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m.

f. Ms. Vicki Takagi, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requests that item No. 8 on the agenda be deleted. The open house and outdoor dance recital will be held inside Squires Student Center and thus would not require Commission approval.

3. Mr. David Newton, representing Alpha Phi Omega, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the following projects:

a. The Bloodmobile--to be held July 6-7, 1977, August 19, 1977, October 18-21, 1977, December 2, 1977, January 18-20, 1978, March 1-3, 1978, April 12-14, 1978, and May 25-26, 1978.

b. The Book Exchange--to be held September 21-30, 1977, January 3-13, 1978, and March 27-April 7, 1978. This is a traditional service project of Alpha Phi Omega, the purpose of which is to return money to students. Ninety percent of the amount collected is returned directly to the students and ten percent is retained by Alpha Phi Omega.

c. Tech Fair--to be held Friday, February 24, 1978 and Saturday, February 25, 1978. The purpose of Tech Fair is to provide a carnival type event and to increase the treasuries of participating student organizations.

d. Open Rush--to be held September 27, 1977, January 10, 1978, and March 30, 1978.

e. Ugly Man on Campus--to be held during Fall Quarter, the specific dates have as yet not been determined. The purpose of this contest is to raise money for handicapped children to attend Camp Easter Seal.

f. Service Project--assisting the Continuing Education Center with Governor's Day.

g. Service Project--sitting in the War Memorial Chapel so as to keep it open Sunday through Thursday evenings from 7:00 to 10:00 p.m.

h. Service Project--giving campus tours for the Admissions Office and weekend tours out of Squires Student Center during parts of Spring Quarter.

Mr. Robert Wagner moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

4. Ms. Barbara Watkins, representing the Student's Transcendental Meditation Society, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor free introductory lectures on the principles and benefits of the transcendental meditation program. These lectures are open to the public and are scheduled for the following dates and times in Squires Student Center:

Ms. Barbara Watkins moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

5. Ms. Dee Dee Clements, representing the Student Budget Board, requested approval of the minutes of the meeting of May 18, 1977. Guidelines for the "Small Grants Program" were included in these minutes. Mr. Robert Lineen moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

6. Ms. Dee Dee Clements, representing the Student Budget Board, requested approval of the Board's recommendation to allocate \$35.00 from the Small Grants Program to the College Republicans Club for a voter registration drive. Ms. Dee Dee Clements moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

General Earl C. Acuff arrived at this point in the meeting.

7. Ms. Dee Dee Clements, representing the Student Budget Board, requested approval of the Board's recommendation to allocate \$756.00 from the Contingency Fund to the Performing Arts Federation to cover a deficit caused by emergency expenses. Ms. Dee Dee Clements moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

8. Ms. Vicki Takagi, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the 4th of July activities to be held Monday, July 4, 1977 and to include a concert on the drillfield from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. with "John Hartford" and "The New Grass Revival", and a fireworks display on the drillfield at 9:30 p.m. The program is open to the public with no admission charge. The Union will contact Dr. Raymond Smoot, Jr. in the Office of the Vice President for Administration for permission to use university facilities. Ms. Vicki Takagi moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

9. Ms. Vicki Takagi, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a bluegrass concert featuring "Olen Gardner" to be held Wednesday, August 10, 1977 at 6:00 p.m. on the Henderson lawn next to Squires. The program is open to the public with no admission charge. The Union will contact Dr. Raymond Smoot, Jr. in the Office of the Vice President for Administration for permission to use university facilities. Ms. Vicki Takagi moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

10. Ms. Vicki Takagi, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a golf tournament to be held Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, August 12, 13, and 14, 1977 at the Virginia Tech Golf Course. Sign-up dates will be August 1-9 for students (limited space available) and August 10-11 for faculty, staff, and guests (providing space is still available). The entry fees which include green fees are as follows: Students--\$3.00; Nonstudents--\$6.00; Season ticket holders--\$2.00. Those interested may sign up for the tournament at Squires Recreation Desk. The tournament schedule will be as follows: Friday, August 12 there will be 18 holes of golf beginning at 2:00 p.m.; Saturday, August 13 there will be 18 holes of golf beginning at 8:00 a.m., and Sunday, August 14 the tournament play-offs will be held beginning at 8:00 a.m. The Union will contact the manager of the VPI Golf Course for permission to use the facilities. Ms. Vicki Takagi moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

11. Ms. Vicki Takagi, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the 1977-78 Concert/Theatre events. The schedule is as follows:

The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
