CALL TYPE: BZ	
1- BZ0AMW:	Recorded only from SF1A male #2
2- BZ20AW:	Recorded from all western males except for SF2A male; See BZ20BW*
3- BZ20BW:	Recorded only from SF2A male; Possible counterpart to BZ20AW*
CALL TYPE: GR	
4- GR22W:	Recorded only from SF1A male #2
5- GR24W:	Recorded only from SF2A male
CALL TYPE: HN	
6- HN22E:	Recorded only from EM male #1
CALL TYPE: HP	
7- HP01DF:	Recorded from both eastern females and only SF1A female in west
8- HP01EFW:	Recorded from all western females except SF2B female; See LR3W*
CALL TYPE: HRP	
9- HRP0A:	Recorded from eastern birds but only males in the west
10- HRP0BME:	Recorded from only EM male #1
11- HRP3BE:	Recorded only from EM female
12- HRP4AE:	Recorded only from EM female; See HRP4BE*
13- HRP4BE:	Recorded only from EF #3 female; Possible counterpart to HRP4AE*
14- HRP21FE:	Recorded once from EM #1 male
CALL TYPE: KLP	
15- KLP20B:	Recorded from all western males but only once from EM #1 male in the east
CALL TYPE: KWP	
16- KWP2E:	Recorded only from EM female
17- KWP3E:	Recorded only from EM female
18- KWP5W:	Recorded only from the SF1A female
CALL TYPE: LR	
19- LR0A:	Recorded from all birds in the east but only males in the west
20- LR1CW:	Recorded only from SF2A female
21- LR3W:	Recorded only from SF2B female; Possible counterpart to HP01EFW*
CALL TYPE: M	
22- M20BW:	Recorded only from SF1A male #1
CALL TYPE: SPS	
23- SPS1E:	Recorded only from EM female
24- SPS21AE:	Recorded only from EF #3 male; See SPS21B*
25- SPS21B:	Recorded from all males except EF #3 male; Possible counterpart to SPS21AE*
CALL TYPE: WHP	
26- WHP1W:	Recorded only from SF1A female and QG female
27- WHP2E:	Recorded only from EM female
CALL TYPE: Z	
28- Z0AW:	Recorded from all western males but from only once from a western female, the QG female
29- Z0CMW:	Recorded only from SF2B male
30- Z01A:	Recorded from all eastern birds and all western males
31- Z01B:	Recorded from all eastern birds and all western males
<p>*A small group of calls which were not recorded from certain individuals are seemingly replaced with versions of those calls unique to the bird from which the original call was not recorded. These paired calls, one used by all but one bird of a particular group and the other used by the individual whose repertoire does not contain the alternate version of the call are referred to as counterparts.</p> <p>It is likely that in many cases where a particular call was not recorded from an individual, especially with respect to the eastern birds, this call may in fact be used by the bird but due to a scarcity of data it was not recorded in this study. An example is that of two calls from the KWP call type category, KWP2E and KWP3E. Both of these calls had been recorded from the EF #3 female prior to this study however, due to an apparent change in behavior the resident pair vocalized very little in the vicinity of the nest cavity and these calls were not recorded from the female during the course of this study</p>
