The Commission on Student Affairs met on Thursday, March 10, 1980 at 4:00 p.m. in Room 344 of Squires Student Center. The following members were absent: Dr. David Ford, Dr. Max Wortman, and Brian Davis. Steve Marksteiner was represented by James Knaup, Mike Hadeed was represented by Ms. Carol Maki, and Dr. George Hugheston was represented by Ms. Ann Marshall.

1. Ms. Kathy Rowe moved for approval of the agenda. The motion was seconded. It was requested that item 11 be moved to item 3. Mr. Tucker moved for approval. The vote was unanimous.
2. Ms. Rowe moved that the minutes of the meeting of March 27, 1980 be approved and distributed. The motion was seconded and Mr. D. K. Brockett called for the question. The motion was passed unanimously.
3. Ms. Robin Daughtrey, representing the Virginia Tech Horticulture Club, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the bedding plant sales. This is an annual event and the Horticulture Club sells vegetable plants and flowering plants to raise money for the club. The sales will be on two weekends (April 26 and May 17) from 8:00 a.m. through 3:00 p.m. at the Virginia Tech green-houses. The facilities have been reserved and there will be no admission charge. The event is open to the public and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Advertising will be through letters to faculty and staff, radio and newspaper ads. General Acuff moved for approval. The motion was seconded and Mr. Brockett called for the question. The vote was unanimous.
4. Mr. John G. Merna, representing the Virginia Tech Striders and Sierra Club, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the Earth Day Fun Run on April 22nd at 5:30 p.m. on the drillfield. The facilities have been reserved and the event is open to the public. There will be no admission charge and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Advertising will be through posters, flyers, and tent cards. Mr. Brockett moved for approval. The motion was seconded and Mr. Tim McKissick called for the question. The vote was unanimous.
5. Mr. Peter Morris, representing the Virginia Tech Dairy Science Club, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the Annual Awards Banquet on May 10th at 6:30 p.m. at the Christiansburg Armory. The facilities have been reserved and there will be an admission charge of \$8.50. Advertising will be through posters. No representative was present from this organization so the item was not considered.
6. Mr. Peter Morris, representing the Virginia Tech Dairy Science Club, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a "Little All-American Dairy Show" on May 10th from 9:00 a.m. through 3:00 p.m. at the Dairy Cattle Pavillion. The facilities have been reserved and there will be no admission charge. The event is open to the public and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Lunch will be available for a cost of \$2.00 - \$2.50. Advertising will be through posters and newspaper. No one was present from this organization so the item was not considered.

7. Ms. Betty Siegel and Ms. Barbara Wilmer, representing the Performing Arts Federation, requested permission to offer the following events after the exam cut-off date next Fall.

(a) Theatre Production II - December 13, 1980 at 8:15 p.m. in Squires Theatre. This is a major legitimate theatre production (the second in our season of five), with full sets, costuming and lighting. The facilities have been reserved and the event will be open to the public. Admission charge will be as follows: Students - \$2.50; Faculty and staff - \$3.00; General public - \$3.50. Advertising will be through posters, radio spots, and press releases.

(b) Christmas Music Gala - December 14, 1980 at 3:00 p.m. in Squires Old Dominion Ballroom. A full program of vocal and instrumental Christmas music, comprised of performances by the Techmen, the New River Valley Symphony, the Choral Union, the University Chor, Jazz and Percussion Ensembles, the New Virginians and the Early Music Consort. Admission charge will be as follows: Children - \$1.50; Students - \$2.00; and General - \$2.50. Advertising will be through posters, public service announcements, and press releases.

Mr. Jim Tucker moved for approval and the motion was seconded. Discussion followed with regard to upholding the University Policy which states that no activity may be conducted during the 48 hour period prior to exams. Mr. McKissick called for the question. The motion was defeated by a vote of 6 yes, 9 no, and 0 abstentions.

8. Ms. Jill Matt, representing the American Chemical Society - Student Affiliates, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor Brice-Wightman's Chemical Magic Show on May 1 and May 2, 1980 at 7:00 p.m. in Room 3 of Davidson Hall. Dr. L. K. Brice will present a chemical magic show and Dr. Wightman will discuss surface chemistry and give a slide presentation. The facilities have been reserved and there will be an admission charge of \$1.00 per person. The event is open to the public and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Advertising will be through flyers and an ad in the Collegiate Times. Ms. J. J. August moved for approval and the motion was seconded. Mr. McKissick called for the question and the vote was unanimous.


9. Mr. John P. Schaaf, representing the Student Government Association, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the SGA Presidential Debate to be aired April 21st at 7:00 p.m. on WUVT. WUVT news staff will prepare questions and a moderator will present them to the candidates. The facilities have been reserved and there will be no admission charge. The event will be open to the public and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Advertising will be through the Collegiate Times and WUVT. Mr. Tucker moved for approval and the motion was seconded. Ms. August called for the question. The motion was passed unanimously.

10. Mr. Randy A. Helper, representing Campus Crusade for Christ, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor College Life Classic on May 8th at 8:00 p.m. in Burruss Hall Auditorium. This event is co-sponsored by the Navigators, the Baptist Student Union, and the Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship. This is a musical concert by an acousitcal Christian Group called the Pat Terry group. The facilities have been reserved and the admission charge will be around \$2.50. Records will be sold in the lobby. The event is open to the public and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Advertising will be through table tent cards,

posters, newspaper, personal invitation, radio, and balloons. There will be paid musicians who will received \$850 or 40% of gross ticket sales.

11. Mr. Eddie Stowe, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a popular concert on May 10th at 8:00 p.m. in Burruss Auditorium. The facilities have been reserved and there will be an admission charge of \$7.50 for students and \$8.50 for the general public. The event is open to the public and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Advertising will be through posters, tent cards, radio spots, and newspaper ads. Mr. Stowe moved for approval and the motion was seconded. Mr. Brockett called for the question and the vote was unanimous.
12. Mr. Ray Wasielewski, representing the Student Budget Board, requested an extension of time for the Student Budget Board to review a statement concerning payments to individual student from organizations which are funded through the Student Budget Board. The Commission acknowledged the request. Mr. Wasielewski also reported that a balance of \$1,212 remained in the Small Grants fund.
13. Mr. Ray Wasielewski, representing the Student Budget Board, requested that no additional money be allocated from the Contingency Fund for travel to the National Forensics tournament by members of the Performing Arts Federation (Materials were provided for Commission members). Mr. Wasielewski moved to accept the decision of the Student Budget Board. Ms. Karen Moran, representing the Performing Arts Federation, presented new budget figures to the Commission and asked that the Student Budget Board reconsider their request for funds. Mr. Wasielewski withdrew his motion and stated that the Student Budget Board would reconsider the request. No objections were raised. The Commission agreed to abide by the final decision of the Student Budget Board since the next Commission meeting would be conducted after the trip was scheduled.
14. Mr. Stephen G. Harrill, representing the Residence Hall Federation, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the "Roommate Game" Final on April 17th at 8:00 p.m. in Ambler-Johnston Dorm. This event is similar to the television game show The Newlywed Game. Each dorm in the Praire Quad will hold individual games and the winners of each will participate in the final. The facilities have been reserved and there will be an admission charge of \$.25. The event will be open to the public and no alcoholic beverages will be served. Advertising will be through signs and tent cards. Ms. Randolph moved for approval. The motion was seconded and Ms. Rowe moved for approval. The vote was unanimous.
