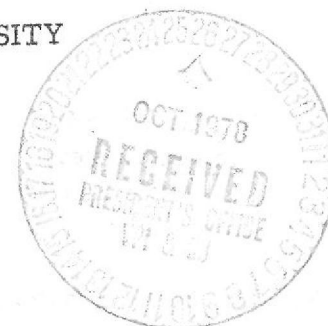

SUBJECT: Minutes of the meeting of October 19, 1978

The Commission on Student Affairs met on Thursday, October 19, 1978 at 4:00 p.m. in Room 344 of Squires Student Center. The following members were absent: Cadet Littleton Dudley represented by Mr. Tom Bishop; Dean J. R. Nichols represented by Dr. David Ford; Dr. Lawrence Adler; Dr. George Hugheston; and Mr. Tim McKissick. The following items were considered:

1. The minutes of the meeting of October 5, 1978 were approved as distributed.
2. The agenda was approved as distributed.
3. The Commission on Student Affairs elected one student to serve a two year term on the Student Budget Board. Student organizations which have a seat on the Commission had the opportunity to nominate one person for this position by submitting a letter to the Chairman, Dr. James W. Dean, by October 12, 1978. A ballot was prepared and distributed to the Commission members at the meeting. The nominees and their sponsoring organizations were as follows:

Mr. Jim Barrett, sponsored by the Student Government Association was elected by the Commission to serve a two year term on the Student Budget Board.

4. Mr. Mike Saxton, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor a popular concert featuring Livingston Taylor and Pablo Cruise on Friday, November 10, 1978 at 8:00 p.m. in Cassell Coliseum. The facilities for this program have been reserved. The program is open to the public with an admission charge of \$4.50 for students and \$5.50 for the general public. No alcoholic beverages will be served. The program will be advertised

through the Union Quarterly Events Calendar, local radio stations, Collegiate Times, posters, tent cards in the dining halls, flyers and local newspapers. Mr. Mike Saxton moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed un-animously.

5. Mr. Mike Saxton, representing the Virginia Tech Union, requested permission to advertise prior to and sponsor the Broadway Series and the Concert Series portion of the Concert/Theatre Series.

Each of the programs in the Broadway Series and Concert Series will begin at 8:00 p.m. in Burruss Hall Auditorium. The facilities have been reserved for these programs. The programs are open to the public with the above stated admission charges. No alcoholic beverages will be served. The programs will be advertised through the Union Quarterly Events Calendar, local radio stations, Collegiate Times, posters, flyers, tent cards in the dining halls and the Concert/Theatre Series brochure. Mr. Mike Saxton moved for approval. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
