

**Concrete vs. Abstract Activity—Version 3 (Group C)**

A **noun** is a **naming** word. It names a person, place, or thing.

In your notebook, make a T-chart with headings labeled CONCRETE and ABSTRACT, like the one shown below:

<b>Concrete Nouns</b>	<b>Abstract Nouns</b>
A <b>concrete</b> noun names something you can see, hear, touch, smell, or feel.	An <b>abstract</b> noun names a feeling or quality that you <b>cannot</b> see, hear, touch, smell, or feel.
