Dear Dr Likens,

I am writing to you to obtain permission to reprint a table you had created a while ago. The table in question is Table 9-4, on page 193, in the following publication: Helmut Lieth and Robert H. Whittaker (eds.), *Primary Productivity of the Biosphere*, Springer-Verlag, (c) 1975. A representative of Springer told me that they do not hold copyright for electronic publication of the material (see email copied below), and that I should contact the editors. Figuring that at the time the book was published the question of e-rights was not one that would have come up, I decided to start with you, instead, as you are the author of chapter 9.

The table will be used in two publications, both to be available in pdf format only: (1) my masters student's (Niffy Saji's) thesis on lake zone determination;

and (2) a document titled "A Guide to Lake and Reservoir Zone Determination", created for the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (VaDEQ). Both these uses are by non-profit entities. In the case of VaDEQ, the document will be used principally by their staff to help them identify the lacustrine region of lakes and reservoirs (Virginia's lake standards currently apply only to the lacustrine zone), but it may be posted for public access on the VaDEQ website. My student's thesis will be available via Virginia Tech's theses and dissertation depository at <http://scholar.lib.vt.edu/theses/> for public use.

Please let me know if we can obtain permission to reprint the table in both e-documents. If, perchance, you do not have the e-rights, or feel that I should contact the editors (one of whom is deceased, I believe) instead, please let me know that, too. I am told by those more knowledgeable than me in copyright issues that, unless you explicitly gave away e-rights or gave away all rights in perpetuity (rather than just for the book), you still hold the e-rights, but I don't know for sure if that information is correct or not.
