### III. Scope of Work

A. There are five (5) Magisterial Districts in the County and nine (9) communities, but it has been found that organization which follows the school community will provide a better opportunity for the members to attend club meetings. Therefore, Home Demonstration Clubs have been organized according to school communities with all five (5) Magisterial Districts considered. To date six (6) Clubs have been organized with a total membership of seventy-five (75) homemakers. The Clubs are named according to school communities and they are: Burrowsville, Harrison Grove, Old Academy, Loving Union, Providence, and Disputanta.

Club women have been instrumental in informing the women in their communities who have not been directly contacted by the Agent of the proposed Home Demonstration Program for 1949 and inviting them to come to the December meeting.

- B. Three (3) 4-H Clubs have been organized to carry out the youth phase of the extension program for 1949. The total membership is eighty-seven (87), including forty-two (42) girls.
- C. About three hundred and ninety (390) persons have been reached through church meetings and school league meetings where the Agent was given a chance to discuss the development of the homemaking phase of the extension program in the County.

D. Neighborhood and community leaders have turned in seventy (70) names of housewives whom they have contacted and to whom have attempted to explain the nature of the extension program and who in turn have manifested an interest in the work.

E. Forty-seven(47) different homes have been visited in connection with the extension program and a total of sixty-six(66) home visits made to date. Four hundred (400) circulars entitled "Have You Heard?" and "Your Local Home Agent Speaks" were distributed to families through the churches, schools and interested community leaders.

F. Approximately five hundred (500) families have been reached of the approximate number of four hundred forty-two (442) farm families and more than seven hundred (700) non-farmers.

#### IV. Adult Work

A. All Home Demonstration work done this far has been the interpretation of the extension service program and the organization of clubs to carry out extension activities. The county Home Demonstration Committee was formed from the Presidents and Secretaries of the Home Demonstration Clubs.

B. Goals set up by the Home Demonstration Committee are as follows:

1. To create interest in the extension program throughout the county.

2. To improve family health through more food production and better food selection, preparation, and cooperation with other agencies.
3. To improve home kitchens in order to make food preparation a pleasure.
4. To develop leadership for 4-H Clubs.

V. Work with Youth

A. The Agent visited schools and junior league meetings to discuss 4-H Club organization and the activities of 4-H Clubs. Organization of the clubs took place at the first meeting called by the Farm and Home Agents. Each Club has held one meeting and the Home Agent gave the girls the first demonstration of the Housekeeping Project, namely, "Care of the Room" which the forty-two (42) girls enrolled are taking.
