Hokie Wellness employee flu shot clinics begin Sept. 29

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) at https://www.cdc.gov/flu/season/index.html, and because of the COVID-19 pandemic, reducing the spread of respiratory illnesses, like flu, this fall and winter is more important than ever. A flu vaccine can help protect yourself, your family, and your community and help reduce pressure on our healthcare system. The CDC recommends getting a flu vaccination in September or October.

Hokie Wellness flu shot clinics: Hokie Wellness (https://hokiewellness.vt.edu/) will offer flu shot clinics for employees beginning Sept. 29. All clinics will be from 8 a.m. – 3 p.m. In order to maintain safety and ensure physical distancing:

- Blacksburg campus clinics will be held at two locations this year on the following days:
 - North End Center, Room 2420, 8 a.m. 3 p.m.: Sept. 29 and Oct. 1, 6, 23, 29
 - Steger Hall, conference center foyer, 8 a.m.
 3 p.m.: Oct. 14, 21, 28
- Roanoke campus clinics will be held in Room M-106 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sept. 30 and Oct. 27.

All employees must schedule an appointment for their flu shot. Individuals without an appointment will not be admitted to the clinic. Please note the following:

- Faculty and staff must bring their current insurance card to receive a free flu shot or pay a \$25 fee by cash or check.
- Flu shots are free for non-student wage employees. Non-student wage employees must bring their Hokie Passport to the clinic.
- Masks and physical distancing will be required at all clinics.

To schedule an appointment, visit **training. vt.edu**, click on Coursewhere, complete 2-factor authentication, then "Search by Alpha" to select the clinic and register for an open appointment. You will receive a confirmation by email. Please be on time for your appointment. Late arrivals may have to reschedule their flu shot.

NOTE: In order to minimize visitors to Virginia Tech campuses, flu clinics will only be open to employees. See below for information on how to get a flu shot for dependents covered by university health care plans.

Other ways to get a flu vaccine: Vaccinations are also available at most local pharmacies and through health care providers. State health plan members may get a free flu vaccine at pharmacies participating

in their health plan's network.

- COVA Care, COVA HDHP, and COVA HealthAware members also may receive shots at no cost from network physicians' offices and other participating providers.
- Kaiser Permanente HMO members must go to a participating Kaiser medical center.
- Optima Health members will receive flu shots at no cost from network participating pharmacies.
 To find participating pharmacies, call the number on the back of your ID card.

Visit http://www.dhrm.virginia.gov/healthcoverage/flushotinformation for more information from the Virginia Department of Human Resource Management. It is recommended that you call ahead to confirm that a pharmacy is participating in the program and that shots are available. An appointment may be required.

On-campus pickup locations:

- Derring Hall overhang (back of building)
- Litton-Reaves Hall parking lot (behind building)

How to place an order:

- Orders must be placed 12 hours in advance.
- Visit https://blacksburgdelivers.com.
- Select the restaurant you'd like to order from.
- Select the pickup date and time. Currently, there are two pickup times to choose from: 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. Orders will be held for an hour-and-a-half.
- Select "Derring Hall" or "Litton-Reaves Hall" before you select the food you will be ordering. This will ensure the meal goes to the on-campus pickup spot you select.
- Debit and credit cards are accepted as payment.

How to retrieve an order:

- Visit the Derring Hall overhang (second floor outdoor area facing the parking lot) or the parking lot behind Litton-Reaves Hall (if driving, enter the lot from Life Sciences Circle; if walking, walk down the path/stairs between Litton-Reaves Hall and Wallace Hall from West Campus Drive).
- Show your Hokie Passport or government-issued ID.
- Pick up your food.
- Enjoy at one of the many outdoor spaces on campus, in your residence hall room, or office.

- LinkedIn Learning: Develop skills through business, software, creative, and technology courses. Study for a certification, improve time management skills, take courses in specific software, and much more through a catalog of thousands of courses.

- TLOS Professional Development Network: As a unit of Technology-enhanced Learning and Online Strategies (TLOS), the Professional Development Network facilitates and leverages campus-wide partnerships to offer programming and training opportunities designed to foster technology integration and increase digital fluency for faculty, staff, and graduate students at Virginia Tech.
