You will have the opportunity to rotate to three different sessions, so make sure to indicate your top three picks when you register. Check out the all the breakout options and register below!



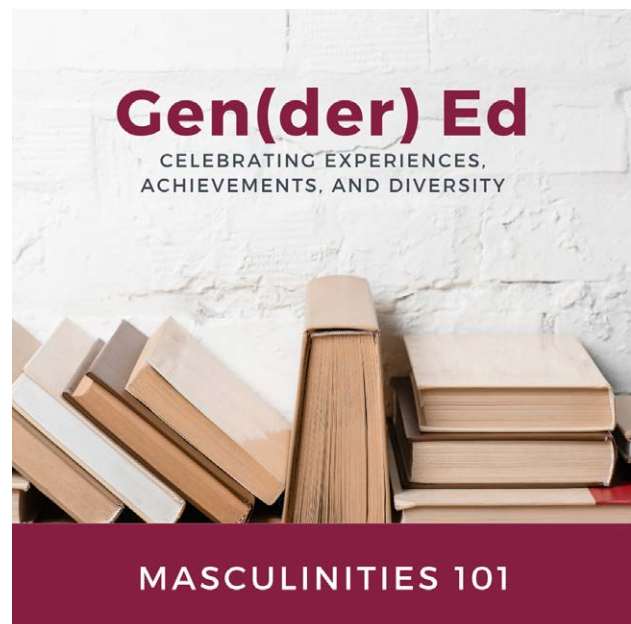
