Hi Laura:

This message is a follow-up to our phone conversation a few minutes ago. I'm finishing up a Ph.D. at Virginia Tech, Blacksburg and am planning to include two of my published articles (I'm first author on both) from Elsevier into my dissertation. I've obtained copyrights for reproducing

both articles into my dissertation from the Copyright Clearance Center. However, my dissertation is in a single column format, while the published versions of both articles are in the standard two-column journal format. I'm writing to ask if Elsevier can provide me with a letter that states that "as long as the text, figures and tables remain the same, it is ok for me to reproduce them in my dissertation in any format/type-set that I see fit, although this format may be very different from the actual published version." or words to this effect.
